#### **Crossmark NZ deal**

**RETAIL** services specialist Crossmark Asia Pacific has announced the acquisition of NZbased pharmacy services company Richmond Healthcare for an undisclosed amount.

CEO John Wright said the deal allows Crossmark to be the "first retail services company to provide a seamless service offering across the Australian and New Zealand pharmacy markets".

Crossmark said it intends to introduce an innovative approach to field presentation, sales ordering and client reporting in both countries that will "better allow clients to adjust to their respective market changes".

The combined business will be managed by Crossmark gm Pharmacy, Lane Russell, with Richmond chief Mark Hemmings to take on the new role of NZ business mgr, reporting to Russell.

Crossmark said it intends the integration of the two businesses to be as seamless as possible, with all key sales and administrative personnel from Richmond having been offered roles with Crossmark which mirror their current positions.

# **CSO** requirement breach?

CNS Pharma is accusing the three major full line wholesalers of breaching the conditions of the Community Service Obligation.

The company said that Sigma, API and Symbion are refusing to purchase its Esipram (escitalopram oxalate) in accordance with new trading terms introduced by CNS Pharma in mid-Oct.

CNS said as a result supplies of the medication to some pharmacies have been disrupted in recent weeks, and it's instead appointed DHL Exel Supply Chain as a distributor for Esipram direct to pharmacy, on an indefinite basis.

CNS Pharma gm Klaus Abel said the company had "repeatedly urged the wholesalers to

reconsider their stance," adding that he "regards their ongoing refusal to purchase as a breach of their Community Service Obligations which require guaranteed supply to pharmacy of PBS listed medicines."

The appointment of DHL is effective from tomorrow, and gives pharmacies several options for placing orders including phone, fax, online and via electronic ordering.

Abel said CNS Pharma was fully stocked and "committed to ensuring patients and pharmacies have the necessary and timely access to supplies of Esipram.

## **GSK** settles Reliant

**GLAXOSMITHKLINE** has completed its acquisition of US drugmaker Reliant Pharmaceuticals for US\$1.65b.

Reliant sells the cardiovascular drug Lovaza (omega-3-acid ethyl estes), with GSK saying it thinks the medicine has "significant potential to help larger numbers of patients, and we expect it to become an important driver of sales growth in the US".

## **US** convictions for compounders


FIVE Florida-based pharmacists have been sent to prison for their roles in defrauding the US Medicare system.

The ringleader of the scam was a man named Rodolfo Aenile, who allegedly conspired with several pharmacies to make claims, with patients paid kickbacks.

Reports say Aenile entered into an arrangement with several corrupt Miami pharmacies, who were paid US\$14m between 2000 and 2003 to compound medicine based on prescriptions for noncommercially available aerosol medications.
