HEALTHSCOPE this morning cancelled the Extraordinary General Meeting of Symbion planned for this Fri, after the Australian Tax Office gave an adverse capital gains tax ruling about the proposed takeover.

The bid is now in disarray, with the separate sale of Symbion Pharmacy and Consumer to private equity firms Ironbridge and Archer Capital also not eligible for the tax exemption.

In a later development Healthscope entered into an "equity swap arrangement" with Goldman Sachs JBWere Capital Markets, giving it an economic interest in 9.99% of Symbion, saying the move will "give it an opportunity to participate in the determination of control of Symbion Health".

PBS Online early payment THE first PBS Online incentive will be paid to participating pharmacists on 4 Dec 2007 instead of Jan 2008, as previously advised by Medicare Australia.

Since Medicare issued notices to all pharmacies back in June, the Pharmacy Guild of Australia has made significant representations requesting the payment date be brought forward for all 4800 PBS Online pharmacies.

A 40 cent incentive for each script submitted to Medicare Australia via online claiming has been entitled to pharmacists since 1 July 2007.

National president of the Pharmacy Guild of Australia, Kos Scalvos said "this first payment will relate to prescriptions submitted to Medicare Australia through PBS Online in the period 1 July to 30 September.

ANOTHER negative connotation for smoking has been revealed in a new study of 740 men in Taiwan.

The research, published in Archives of Dermatology, found that Asian men were more likely to lose their hair if they smoked.

Smoking at least 20 cigarettes a day led to an increased risk of androgenetic alopecia (male pattern baldness) in the study group, suggesting that smoking may destroy hair follicles.

BRITISH health union leaders have raised concerns about the use of household cleaning products to sanitise the UK's ambulances.

Paramedics are complaining about not being provided with proper cleaning materials, with concerns the makeshift solutions could be leading to the spread of antibiotic-resistant 'superbugs' such as MRSA.

One ambulance officer said: "We use Mr Muscle to clean with. I have no idea whether it kills MRSA.
