Coming heparin shortage?

THE Pharmacy Guild has issued a revised Request for Tender for one of the projects being funded under the Fourth Agreement.

Guild updates RFT

The 'Improving Medication Compliance' RFT now gives a reference to the Guild's new MedsIndex measurement system, and the R&D steering committee has also advised that potential respondents that projects focusing on cardiovascular healthcare aren't likely to be funded, to prevent possible duplication with other projects.

The new closing date for the RFT is now 19 May 08.

DES TGA advice

THE TGA has issued further advice for women exposed to diethylstilboestril (DES), a synthetic oestrogen used between 1940 and the early 1970s to prevent miscarriage.

Exposure in the womb to DES has been shown to be associated with a higher risk of cancer, with women aged over 40 who were exposed advised to have an annual mammogran.

PSA lectures

PSA Qld has changed the date for its 'Dental Topics in Pharmacy' lecture to 06 May, and it will be held at the General Practice Cairns Boardroom, covering dental first aid; oral mucosa injuries and infections; preventative medicine; and paediatric issues.

On the same day, a lecture on weight loss and obesity management will be held at the Uni of Queensland, Brisbane.

Speakers Nicola Moore and Neil Holt will explain the benefits and pitfalls of ketosis, thermogenesis and VLCDs: both functions are free of charge for PSA members.

FIVE batches of the Sanofi-Aventis drug, Clexane (enoxaparin) were recalled last night by the Therapeutic Goods Administration.

The blood-thinning medication has caused a contamination scare in the US, where it has been linked to several deaths.

"To date, in Australia, there have been no reports of adverse events of the type reported in the US associated with heparin products," TGA said in a statement.

"Nevertheless, the TGA has decided to quarantine the affected batches of Clexane so no patients are put at undue risk at this time."

The US Food and Drug Administration investigated hundreds of cases of adverse reactions to heparin use, including 81 deaths which involved related symptoms, but no causal link has been found.

Mixed results for prostate cancer

COCHRANE researchers have found both good and bad results in their examination of the effect of certain drugs on prostate cancer.

Compared to placebo, 5-alphareductase-inhibitors (5-ARIs) can reduce a man's chance of being diagnosed with prostate cancer from around 5-9% to around 4-6% (during up to seven years of treatment).

But when cancer was detected, it was more likely to be of a more dangerous, high-grade cancer.

This may be because the drug alters the way tumour cells grow, researchers suggested.

According to the FDA, contaminated shipments of the blood thinner had been traced from China to 11 countries, including Australia, but the impact was thought to be greater in the US because of higher doses administered to patients.

Chinese officials have declined to accept responsibility for the contamination.

Last month AstraZeneca recalled 100,000 doses of heparinised saline in Australia.

Other heparin products are still available here, but the TGA has warned there could be future shortages.

The affected batches are: Clexane 20 mg, Batch No. 02115; Clexane 40 mg, Batch No. 04526; Clexane 80 mg, Batch No. 08009; Clexane 100 mg, Batch No. 01007; and Clexane 100 mg, Batch No. 01011.

CBA targets health

AUSTRALIA'S first Ambassador for Ageing, Noeline Brown, will today undertake one of her first official duties by having an influenza injection.

Ms Brown, 69, will be accompanied by the Minister for Ageing, Justine Elliot and Minister for Infrastructure Anthony Albanese on a visit to the Petersham Medical Surgery.

New generics code

HEALTH minister Nicola Roxon has expressed support for industry-wide standards on drug company hospitality.

The current voluntary code doesn't apply to generics makers who aren't members of Medicines Australia, which has expressed concern about the Sigma Mediterranean cruise last Oct attended by 300 pharmacists.
