SANOFI-AVENTIS has pointed out that the withdrawal of Clexane (enoxaparin) by the TGA (PD yesterday) is purely precautionary, with no connection to deaths linked to other heparin products in the US.

"None of the events are involving Clexane," a Sanofi spokesperson told *PD* yesterday.

A US probe has linked contamination originating in China to the incidents.

SUPPLIERS wanting to visit one of the 123 Pharmacy Alliance stores across Australia will now need a special card, which has been introduced as a new "uniform and efficient way of dealing with suppliers."

Fresh ADHD fears

A US study has found 19 children who were receiving treatment for ADHD died suddenly between 1999 and 2004, raising fresh fears over the stimulant drugs prescribed for the disorder.

According to the US Food and Drug Administration, apart from the 19 children who died, another 26 had cardiovascular events such as strokes, cardiac arrests and heart palpitations.

The American Heart Association has recommended that children should first undergo cardiac evaluation before taking the drugs.

TRADITIONAL medicine is causing a major panic in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Africa where police have arrested 13 "sorcerers" accused of using black magic to steal or shrink men's penises.

Rumours of penis theft began circulating last week, with talkback radio shows fuelling what's become mass hysteria.

Victims claim the witchdoctors just touched them to make their genitals shrink or disappear, and then demanded cash in return for a cure.

The police chief in the capital, Kinshasa, said "I'm tempted to say it's one huge joke.

"But when you try to tell the victims that their penises are still there, they tell you that it's become tiny or that they've become impotent.

"To that I tell them, 'How do you know if you haven't gone home and tried it?'" he said.
