New PAH treatment

THE listing of Tracleer on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme has been hailed as a huge step forward in improving the quality of life for children with congenital heart defects who may develop Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension.

"The availability of Tracleer (bosentan) on the PBS provides a new treatment option for people with Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension associated with existing or repaired congenital heart defects," Associate Professor Robert Weintraub from the Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne said today.

The medication had previously been reimbursed for PAH associated with other causes and from this month this has now been expanded to include PAH associated with congenital heart defects including Eisenmenger's physiology patients (PAH-CHD).

Plunkett new PSA Pres

WARWICK Plunkett has been elected as the new national president of the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia.

Elected at a board meeting held in Canberra yesterday, Mr Plunkett said he aimed to mould the newly unified organisation into a strong base for the future.

"My job is primarily to get us off to a solid start with strong foundations," he said.

Two vice-presidents were also elected: Shane Jackson and Grant Kardachi.

The outgoing president, Brian Grogan, who served a record term of three and a half years, will take up a seat on the Board in an observer's position as Immediate Past President.

Mr Grogan congratulated Mr Plunkett on being elected.

"As a past National President, Warwick brings to the office enormous expertise and experience in representing the profession which will drive the new national organisation forward," he said.

In reflecting on his achievements while in office, Mr Grogan said he was most proud of the success of the process to create a truly unified PSA.

"I can already see benefits from the unification with PSA working to put a greater focus on providing better professional development opportunities for members as well as a stronger focus on practice support," he said.

"Over time I can see that there will be a stronger, faster and more united response to issues affecting the profession."

Mr Grogan also paid tribute to the PSA Transitional Authority representatives, PSA staff, his Board colleagues and the Society's members "who collectively make the Society what it is."

> HE'S either exceptional or else takes alot of mulitvitamins, but one athlete is proving that age is no hurdle when it comes to collecting Olympic gold.

A 67 year old Japanese man has been confirmed as the oldest participant at the Beijing Olympics, starting tomorrow.

The equestrian competitor, Hiroshi Hoketsu, competed in his first Olympics in 1964, when he finished 40th.

Now, after a 44 year hiatus, he's back in the saddle and ready to go for gold, with the 2008 games to be just his second Olympic appearance.

He's the oldest competitor ever to represent Japan.

The oldest ever competitor was 72 year old Swedish shooter Oscar Swahn, who won a silver medal at Antwerp in 1920.

MEANWHILE reports have emerged that Japanese men are worrying more about body odour, with a range of products from odour-eating suits to chewing gums flooding the market.

The trend to anti-odour products was sparked eight years ago by a laboratory who said they'd found a substance that they promptly dubbed 'kareishu', or ageing odour, which apparently sets in at age 40.
