UP to 800 pharmacies across Australia are being recruited to participate in Stage 2 of the Diabetes Pilot Program.

The Pharmacy Guild and PSA today announced the move, with community pharmacies in both rural and metropolitan locations that meet the eligibility requirements able to participate.

Selection will be on a 'first in first served' basis, taking into

account Pharmacy Access/ Remoteness Index of Australia (PhARIA) criteria.

The Diabetes Medication Assistance Service aims to help patients with poorly controlled type 2 diabetes to improve selfmanagement of their condition.

It includes a series of inpharmacy consultations to assess, manage and review the condition.

health system and this pilot continues to examine the role community pharmacy can play," Sclavos said.

Participating pharmacies are required to engage up to 14 eligible patients with poorly controlled diabetes and provide them with five consultations over a six month period.

The pharmacist involved must have undertaken specialist PSA and AACP training.

## Herpes treatment

PATIENTS with recurrent genital herpes should be offered a two-day higher-dose course of antiviral for self-treatment, according to a study of 873 patients in Sydney.

Compared to the current fiveday regime of 125mg twice daily, researchers found a two-day course that starts with 500mg stat dose of famciclovir and then 250mg twice daily was slightly more effective.

When treatment was started within 12 hours of prodromal symptoms, recurrence occurred in 24% of patients on the two-day course and 28% of those taking the standard five-day course, study co-author Dr Mark Bloch wrote in this month's Sexual Health journal.

## Flu affects few

THE flu has affected far fewer people this year, according to the Department of Health and Ageing.

The collected figures show 475 official notifications of influenza in July - 2,000 less than last year. August has also seen "low activity", with only 97 reports compared to more than 5,000 last August, with half this year's notifications from Queensland, followed by NSW, with little reporting from other states.
