ANTIDEPRESSANTS are the most common PBS medicines used by young women, not the contraceptive pill, according to a maior study.

The report, 'Use and costs of medications and other healthcare resources: Findings from the Australian Longitudinal Study on Women's Health', found that in females aged 18-23, the most commonly identified PBS claims were for nervous system drugs, particularly antidepressants.

New women's policy

THE Government has released a paper outlining the aims of the new National Women's Health Policy.

The new policy - a Federal Labor election commitment - will emphasise prevention and health inequalities in Australia and address the needs of women of all ages and cultural backgrounds.

Antidepressants were also common among mid-age women (14%) and older women (18%) with the prevalence of these medications increasing with age.

ADs popular for women

But not all young women diagnosed with depression were taking the drugs - in 2005, 60% had no claims for any antidepressant medication, up from 40% in 2002.

But women who ceased antidepressants between 2002 and 2005 were scoring higher on the Mental Health Index, "indicating positive outcomes for women in this group", the report concluded.

2009 bad for pharma

PHARMACEUTICALS may not be as recession-proof as commonly believed, according to the latest Fitch ratings.

The highly regarded ratings agency has issued a negative outlook for both the US & European pharmaceutical sectors for 2009.

With the approach of 2010-2012, when a number of blockbuster drugs come off patent, the concern is that big pharma companies will respond through debt-based acquisitions.

Fitch also expects the wider US healthcare industry to struggle under the new Obama Government.
