PSA NSW says yes

NSW PSA branch members voted overwhelmingly in favour of the establishment of a national organisation at an extraordinary general meeting held on Tue.

More than 30 members and staff attended the historic meeting, with about 200 more lodging proxy votes.

The two resolutions to finalise NSW constitutional changes allowing the establishment of a single, united national organisation were passed without dissent.

Steroid suicide

A PHARMACIST in the US, who was a prime suspect in a steroid scandal involving NYPD officers, has reportedly killed himself.

John Rossi, 56, the co-owner of Lowen's Pharmacy in NewYork, was found in his home with a gunshot wound to the head.

Police discovered 90g of raw human growth hormone, worth US\$8 million, plus testosterone, nandrolone, and stanozolol in an October raid on his pharmacy, as part of a probe into pharmacies selling HGH and steroids online.

API pharmacy up 23%

AUSTRALIAN Pharmaceutical Industries this morning advised that sales in its Pharmacy division for the five months to 31 Jan were up 23% on the same period last year to more than \$1 billion.

CEO Stephen Roche said "organic growth of the business has been pleasing and the integration of Alphapharm products has been successfully completed."

"This is why we need to continue to invest in educating the future of pharmacy and why smoking cessation advice and product recommendations should remain in the domain of those professionally qualified to give that advice," she said.

SUPERMARKET chain Aldi in the UK has completely sold out of its Siana Moisturising Anti-Wrinkle Cream.

The product, which costs about \$3, has been named the most effective anti-ageing cream on the market.

It was a surprise outcome from the study carried out on 2000 women which compared a range of products, some costing hundreds of dollars.

Aldi is now frantically restocking the stores after seeing sales rocket 800%.

PEDICULOSIS has been around for a very long time.

Scientists have just tested head lice taken from 1000-yearold mummified remains in Peru.

DNA testing showed the ancient lice were almost identical to other strains found around the globe, with Florida University researcher David Reed saying the results prove that the creatures accompanied humanity as they spread across the globe from Africa.

The two mummies must have been fairly itchy, with the scientists finding more than 500 in their elaborately braided hair.

"It was amazing. It really was remarkable how lousy they were," Reed said.
