A NEW loyalty scheme introduced in Dec by Chemmart has signed up more than 30,000 members in its first month.

Dubbed Chemmart Rewards, the program is an initiative designed to defent the brand from the competitive threat posed by discounters, according to Inside Retailing magazine.

Members are able to earn 'Chemmart Cash' equivalent to 5% of non-prescription purchases.

It's now been rolled out to more than 160 Chemmart pharmacies across Australia, after a trial in which participants reported an increase in average transaction value and visitation.

Modelling showed that stores only needed to increase sales by 2% for the system to pay for itself.

The system utilises technology dubbed "Graphicard" which has a rewritable area on the cards.

When customers make a purchase the card is reprinted with the new points balance, giving instant feedback.

SOME of the biggest drugmakers in the world were the subject of dawn raids by European Commission authorities overnight as part of a wide-ranging probe into possible collusion.

Information was reportedly sought from companies including Pfizer, GlaxoSmithKline, Johnson & Johnson, AstraZeneca, Merck & Co and Sanofi-Aventis.

EU Competition Commissioner Neelie Kroes said the regulator suspected a conspiracy between the firms which aimed to delay the development of generic alternatives to branded drugs.

"If innovative products are not being produced and cheaper generic alternatives to existing products are in some cases being delayed, then we need to find out why and if necessary take action."

At issue is whether the companies created barriers to competitors, whether they misused patent rights or engaged in "vexatious litigation".

The EU has previously undertaken so-called 'sector enquiries' into energy, financial services and telecommunications, but it's the first time a probe has

The commission said that patents, litigation and settlement agreements are "by their nature highly confidential.

"Such information may also be easily withheld, concealed or destroyed - this is why inspections have been considered appropriate," a spokesman said.

The commision said it's concerned about a lack of innovation, citing a drop in the number of new molecular entities launched in recent years.

#### Vic Guild meeting

THE Australian Industrial Registry has requested that the Victorian branch of the Pharmacy Guild of Australia hold a "special general meeting" to present its 06/07 annual report to members.

The move is required because the Workplace Relations Act mandates that the report must be provided to members 21 days before the Annual General Meeting

The AGM was held on 25 Sep 07 but due to awaiting audit clearance of PCA NU Systems the report was only available 14 days before the meeting, not 21.

Although it was available in full on the Victorian Guild's website from 11 Sep, the procedural requirement still applies and so the Special General Meeting will be held at 7.15pm on 05 Feb at Guild House, 40 Burwood Road Hawthorn Vic.

#### **DISPENSARY** CORNER

PUBERTY at the age of three? That's what happened to a UK toddler, whose story is being reported this week.

Hayley Smith's mother said her daughter started developing body odour, greasy hair and mood swings in a condition known as precocious puberty.

The child started menstruating at the age of 8 and now wears a C-cup bra at the age of 12.

A number of causes have been postulated, including higher levels of hormones in the environment and even increasingly sexualised TV shows. A POINT of sale system glitch is being blamed for a near-riot at a German petrol station this week.

Massive gueues developed at the servo in the town of Iserlohn when instead of increasing the fuel price by 3c per litre, the pumps began selling fuel for just 3c per litre.

The mishap, due to a computer hiccup, ended after about 5 hours when the service station was closed - with the assistance of the local police. A NEW market for influenza vaccines has been highlighted by researchers in Switzerland.

The head of the National Influenza Research Centre at Geneva University, Yves Thomas, said a recent study had shown that flu viruses can survive on banknotes for up to 17 days.

"Our studies have convinced us that it is possible to catch flu from banknotes, but the chances are very slim and there is no cause for concern among the general population," he said.

However he warned that bank employees and others handling large quantities of notes each day "could be at risk"
