THE Pharmacy Guild has welcomed the introduction of the Trade Practices Amendment Legislation Bill 2008 into Federal Parliament, saying the Bill will give better protection for community pharmacies from anticompetitive behaviour.

**New Trade Practices bill** 

Acting Guild national president Patrick Reid said under current arrangements, practical legal options are very limited.

'The high cost of taking legal action, coupled with confusion surrounding what it means to 'take advantage', and general difficulty in pursuing predatory pricing cases, mean current protections are fairly unhelpful to achieving practical results."

## Nursing home visits

THE Australian Government's Aged Care Standards and Accreditation Agency will this financial year undertake a record 7,000 visits to the nation's 2,870 nursing homes during 2008-09.

More than 3,000 of these visits will be unannounced.

Australian government policy requires that each Commonwealth-subsidised nursing home receives at least one unannounced visit each year.

The increased monitoring assists in the early identification of non-compliance with care standards and also serves to allay public concerns that standards of care at the time of accreditation aren't maintained.

Over the next four years, the Government will invest more than \$40 billion in aged and community care, including \$28.6 billion in nursing homes.

#### TGA business plan

THE Therapeutic Goods Administration has released its 2008-09 Business Plan, now available on its website.

The plan underpins the TGA's Strategic Plan, which identifies key priorities and outlines major project initiatives planned for the next financial year.

In addition, the Department of Health and Ageing Portfolio Budget Statements for 2008-09 outline the performance information on which the TGA will report in the Department of Health and Ageing Annual Report.

## **PPF** seminars

The new legislation allows small businesses to take action against section 46 infringements in the Federal Magistrates Court, a much more affordable option. Other provisions relating to

predatory pricing and below-cost selling have also been amended.

"With the Trade Practices Act strengthened, we also look forward to strong action from the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission in relation to unfair, anti-competitive and predatory behaviour," Reid said.

### Indians susceptible to atherosclerosis

SOUTH Asian Indians are more prone to the atherogenic effects of cholesterol and diabetes, according to Australian research.

A study at the George Institute for International Health in Sydney found that total cholesterol levels and diabetes had much stronger associations with atherosclerosis in 300 Indian patients compared to a sample of more than 1,000 Caucasian Australians.

The findings, published in Atherosclerosis, also show that Indians with higher HDL levels are not protected from atherosclerosis, despite this being the case for white Australians.

## MS drug on PBS

THE first new treatment option for relapsing-remitting multiple sclerosis sufferers in over eight years was yesterday made available on the PBS.

Tysabri is a new drug which clinical trials have shown to reduce relapse rates and slow progression of the disease.

Tysabri is administered by IV infusion every four weeks.
