Profitable drugs promoted

CONSUMER organisation Choice has called on the Federal Government to take a greater role in educating doctors about drugs after it found that heavily advertised, more profitable medicines are prescribed significantly more than cheaper versions.

According to Choice, 93% of advertisements in medical magazines aimed at doctors were for more profitable medicines still under patent.

The Sydney Morning Herald reported that chlorthalidone, a first-line treatment suitable for most uncomplicated hypertension patients, is prescribed much less frequently than the newer product, Coverstyl, which has been heavily promoted in the medical media.

Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme figures show that in 2005/06 there were 35,000 scripts for chlorthalidone, costing between \$6.50 and \$17, compared with 2.8 million for Coverstyl, which costs \$31.40.
