Program for Pharmacy HIP to patent counselling

LISTED pharmacy franchisor Health Information Pharmacy has today announced that it's lodged a worldwide patent application for its 'Chemconsult' Patient Medication Counselling system.

CEO Ken Lee said the process uses a database to match patient and medication data, providing "considerable, unique statistical data relating to medication usage."

He claimed that the system allowed HIP to "supply, for the first time, accurate, prompt feedback on medication use,

Weight loss surgery

A NEW group called the Australian Institute of Weight Control (AIWC) claims that 4200 premature deaths are likely to be saved over the next decade due to weight loss surgery for very obese Australians.

The AIWC comprises a national network of "purpose-built clinics that incorporate surgical interventions into multidisciplinary weight loss programs."

A report released yesterday estimates that obesity is costing the Australian community \$21b a year, with the AIWC establishing a 'Circle of Care' program to set minimum standards for surgeons, clinical quality assurance, long term patient support and a strong base of public health research.

"Negotiations are already under way with some manufacturers and distributors of prescription pharmaceuticals for access to this valuable data," he said.

HIP said the move meant that pharmacists would now have the potential to be "recognised and paid for the valuable work they do in advising on medication issues to help reduce medication problems and provide health outcomes."

RESEARCHERS in Argentina have found that breastfed girls were far less likely than breastfed boys to develop serious respiratory infections requiring a stay in hospital.

The benefits included fewer ear, stomach or intestinal infections, digestive problems, skin diseases and allergies, and less risk of developing high blood pressure, diabetes and obesity.

Pramipexole PBS

PRAMIPEXOLE (Sifrol) has been added to the Pharmaceutical Benefits Schedule for the treatment of Parkinson's disease.

Pramipexole is one of a number of drugs for Parkinson's known to cause compulsive behaviour in about 20% of patients.

UNITED Nations scientists are urging people to eat insects to help save the planet.


