THE National Prescribing Service is developing more toolkits to help pharmacists achieve Quality Use of Medicines (QUM) in aged care facilities.

A new Drug Use Evaluation toolkit on analgesia will be released via the NPS website later this year, complementing the current DUE kits focusing on hypnotics (benzodiazepine and non-benzodiazepine) and antipsychotic drugs. Further toolkits on other topics will also be developed with practical information on how to undertake a DUE.

That's what the richest man in the world, Bill Gates, told a University of Chicago audience last week, urging a major shift in medical research priorities.


"Malaria kills 1 million people a year; baldness hasn't killed anyone yet," he said.
