


Sigma still keen

Viagra turns ten today, having been approved by the US Food and Drug Administration on 27 Mar 1998.

The little blue pill was originally being trialled as a cardiovascular drug but Pfizer senior medical director Brian Klee said patients taking part didn't want to give the medication back because of sildenafil's side effect of "erections that were harder, firmer and lasted longer."

A HOSPITAL in Hawaii has clarified its rules on pets, after a man took a horse up in a lift in order to cheer up a sick relative.

The man and his steed were stopped by security guards on the third floor, apparently after passing through the hospital's lobby without being challenged.

A hospital spokeswoman said there was a visitation policy for dogs and cats, but not for horses.

She said officials managed to remove the visitor and the horse with "just a few scuff marks."
