Sigma decision

SIGMA Pharmaceuticals is expected to announce by the end of the week whether it will proceed with a joint venture with Metcash (*PD* 22 Apr) to purchase Symbion's pharmacy assets.

Rural challenges

THE Health Department has completed a new audit of Australia's rural and regional health workforce, saying the previous govt had relied on 17year-old population figures to develop rural policies.

The audit confirmed that the current supply of health professionals, including pharmacists, in regional areas is not sufficient to meet current needs and will get worse as the population and the workforce age.

New initiatives include the establishment of an Office of Rural Health within the department to drive reform in the sector, as well as examining all existing programs supporting rural health professionals over the next twelve months. THE Australian Drug Evaluation Committee has recommended two new vaccines manufactured by CSL and GlaxoSmithKline, said to be the first inoculations available for the "prevention of influenza caused by a pandemic strain of influenza virus."

CSL's Panvax vaccine and GSK's Pandemrix are both suspensions for injection, containing the new biological entity influenza virus haemagglutinin [H5N1].

ADEC made the decisions at its meeting on 21 Apr, but the resolutions were only gazetted yesterday.

Other products recommended following the meeting included:

- Pfizer's Eraxis (anidulafungin) powder for injection, for the treatment of invasive candidiasis
- Aclasta/Osteovan solution for injection (zoledronic acid) from Novartis for the treatment of osteoporosis with a maximum of three annual doses
