Diabetes drink

PHARMACY staff have a new option to recommend to people who monitor their blood glucose

Glucerna SR is a vanillaflavoured, gluten-free, nutritional powder with a slow-release carbohydrate formula and a low glycaemic index.

According to the developer, Abbott Nutrition, the drink may assist with glycaemic response, when used in conjunction with a healthy diet and exercise regime.

Glucerna SR is only available in pharmacies in a 400g tin which makes approx seven servings, when mixed with water.

The calls follow complaints by White that pharmacists were being sidelined in the current sale of the assets by new owner

Government funds pharmacy projects

THREE projects led by the Victorian College of Pharmacy have been granted almost \$600,000 in Government funding.

Prof Colin Chapman, Prof Michael Dooley and Kevin McNamara will head up the Pharmacy Practice projects, which will study varied roles for community pharmacists.

Prof Chapman will investigate the impact of triage provided by community pharmacies.

'Every community pharmacy in Australia provides primary healthcare, including referral to other healthcare practitioners, but this core activity has never been adequately assessed.

"This will now be done in a project centred on Victoria from the perspectives of consumers. pharmacists and the other providers of healthcare,' said Prof Chapman.

Prof Dooley's project will study the integration of complementary medicines in community pharmacy practice and the ability of community pharmacists to meet these needs.

As reported in PD last week, Mr McNamara will look at pharmacist assessment of adherence, risk and treatment in cardiovascular disease.

SIFROL (pramipexole), a nonergot dopamine agonist, has been PBS approved from 01 Jun.

The approval is for the treatment of advanced Parkinson's disease in combination with levodopa, with the drug said to effectively treat the core motor symptoms of the disease.

"We know that there are many great examples of pharmacies doing great things in their retail environments; and such


pharmacies should be recognised for their achievements," said Richard Vincent, group general manager, pharmacy, API, the principal sponsor.
