PBAC independence fears

THE Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee may be forced to rely on industry funding due to the Govt's decision to fund it only on a cost-recovery basis.

The "backflip", part of this week's Federal Budget announcement, has been criticised by drug companies, experts and Medicines Australia who fear it could impact on the independence of PBAC.

From July 1, pharmaceutical companies will be asked to contribute \$7 million over forward estimates to help run the PBAC.
