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Sigma to target banners

SIGMA Pharmaceuticals said yesterday that growing its Amcal and Guardian banner group membership would be a "key focus for 2009" with a range of initiatives planned to combine "the pharmacist's role as a provider of advice with the sale of products and services."

Speaking at the Sigma agm in Melbourne, ceo Elmo de Alwis said the firm's retail business continued to add to the membership benefits of the brands including the launch of online training, the Xndo weight loss program and the rollout of digital interactive healthcare kiosks.

He said "almost one in every three pharmacies in Australia" had signed up for Sigma's Embrace program and "attention continues to be focussed on further improvement to purchase compliance levels" in the scheme.

De Alwis also outlined a number of initiatives underway, including a major expansion of its OTC range through a deal with pharmaceutical company Cipla.

The Cipla arrangement will see Sigma source a large range of OTC products in analgesics, complementary medicine and other categories "that will significantly enhance our product offering under both the Herron and Sigma brands."

He said Sigma sees the growth of the OTC category as a key initiative for growing its retail

On the pharmaceutical side De Alwis also confirmed that Sigma is close to finalising arrangements with a "large international generics company" to further expand its generics portfolio.

He said Sigma had pulled out of the bidding for Symbion's pharmacy and consumer divisions, but outlined the establishment of a logistics joint venture with grocery firm Metcash which would come into operation if Metcash buys the Symbion businesses.

Under the Metcash JV the logistics and buying functions of the Sigma and Symbion pharmacy wholesaling businesses will be combined to deliver buying and cost synergies to both companies.

De Alwis also declined to forecast Sigma's profits, citing "unprecedented market uncertainty in the lead-up to the introduction of the PBS reforms in August 2008, with pharmacy customers de-stocking to minimise the impact from the price reductions."

SHPA on clinics

THE Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia has welcomed the establishment of GP Super Clinics.

SHPA ceo Yvonne Allinson said it was easy to envisage that in the clinics "pharmacists could develop new work patterns with GPs and other health professionals, including collaborative management plans and pharmacist prescribing."

Pharmacist roles could include taking complex medication histories, documenting medication management plans, consumer education and developing pharmacist managed prescribing programs, she said.

"GP Super Clinics provide the pharmacy profession with a great opportunity to improve consumer health outcomes," Allinson said.
