GLOBAL experts are calling for a switch from prescription-only medicines to over-the-counter (OTC) in a bid to reform the public health system by providing increased access to self care treatments.

The switch would affect pharmacists in particular, as patients would be diverted from the doctor to the pharmacist or retailer, as stated by Nicholas Hall, a global OTC expert and one of the speakers at the upcoming Australian Self-Medication Industry (ASMI) Conference.

He also states the switch will "underpin profound changes in the healthcare system and will alter the way consumers interact with healthcare professionals."
