QUM compliance project

PRICEWATERHOUSECOOPERS Health Advisory Practice will undertake an 18-month pharmacy practice research project focused on medication compliance.

The trial, which will include more than 100 pharmacies across Australia, will develop and evaluate strategies that assist patients who have poor compliance for various reasons.

It will investigate possible indicators and causes for noncompliance and propose specific patient-centred approaches.

The research team will also explore links with services such as Dose Administration Aids, Patient Medication Profile and Home Medicines Review.
