ongoing viability of the company." Last week Health Corporation released its cashflow figures to the exchange, which showed that it "appears to only have sufficient cash to fund its activities for less than two quarters."

#### \$10m Sigma lawsuit

SIGMA Pharmaceuticals is fighting a \$10m damages claim brought by Swiss firm Vifor International, in relation to the development of its Ferrosig injectable iron supplement.

Vifor, a subsidiary of pharmacy giant Galenica, formerly licensed Sigma to sell its Ferrum H product in Australia, but the agreement ended in 2002 before Sigma brought out its own product.

The Swiss firm is alleging that Sigma "misused confidential information of Vifor in developing its iron product Ferrosig," saying Sigma "has caused and continues to cause Vifor loss."

The claim was lodged in the NSW Supreme Court last Dec. This morning Sigma issued a

statement saying it continues to deny the allegations "and will vigorously defend Vifor's claims."

The company's chief financial officer, Stephen Sippel, said other factors needed to be taken into account in assessing its position.

He said it's in the process of arranging additional funding by way of Convertible notes, as well as developing additional revenue streams including its Chemconsult program which assists pharmacists consulting and advising patients.

The firm is also developing a "unique pharmacy management model which involves the company providing management services to pharmacies in return for fees," Sippel said.

The letter to the ASX also said that during the December quarter HIP took on two new franchise stores (compared to a forecast of three) and also "incurred higher than anticipated legal fees in defending an action brought by a former employee."

A BRITISH florist has been forced to change careers after owning a flower shop for 14 years, due to suddenly developing a life-threatening allergy to flowers.

Jan Wass of Wrexham consulted a doctor after developing 'scaling' on her neck, and was told she was close to suffering anaphylactic shock.

"It was a nightmare. I still can't watch the Chelsea Flower Show because it breaks my heart," she said.

However all's well that ends well, with Wass and her husband setting up a successful new business which specialises in celebration balloons, artificial flowers and candy bouquets.

VENEZUELAN president Hugo Chavez has used an interesting technique in the country's current referendum campaign, praising his opposition leaders as being good for the health of the population.

Chavez was mocking what he described as 'ridiculous speeches' by his opponenents in the lead-up to a poll on Sunday to decide whether political terms should be extended.
