New heart drug

A NEW drug designed to prevent chest pains in heart patients has shown promising results in animal studies, say scientists.

In British Journal of Pharmacology, French researchers show that the novel compound F15845 has antiangina activity and can protect heart cells from damage without unwanted side effects.

It works by blocking excess influxes of sodium into heart cells through 'gate' proteins called sodium channels.

"It's completely different from other anti-angina drugs which directly interact with the function of the heart," said lead author of the study, Bruno Le Grand from the Centre de Recherche Pierre Fabre.
