Roxon holds the PBS line

HEALTH minister Nicola Roxon has told attendees at this morning's meeting in Canberra about the PBS approval delays (*PD* yesterday) that there is "no prospect of change" in the government's policy.

Medicines Australia ceo Brendan Shaw told **PD** that while he was pleased Roxon engaged with the industry by taking part in the meeting, the outcome is "very disappointing."

He said Roxon had confirmed that Cabinet would continue to be involved in the PBS approval process for new drugs, and declined to give any timetable for a

Natural Viagra alert

THE Therapeutic Goods
Administration has warned that a
product called 'Natural Vigra
VIAGRA tablets' contains
therapeutic quantities of sildenafil.

In a safety advisory issued today, the TGA says it's aware that some Australian consumers have purchased the product over the internet, and is advising that it may be harmful if taken without the supervision of a medical professional "particularly in patients with history of cardiovascular disease".

Consumers are being urged to advise extreme caution about purchasing medicines from unknown overseas internet sites because "products purchased in this way may not meet the same standards of quality, safety and efficacy as those approved by the TGA for supply in Australia"

return to the previous arrangements where PBAC recommendations were accepted unless they exceeded a \$10m threshold for cabinet consideration.

Shaw said that the issue is related to the government's fiscal constraints, and not to the overall sustainability of the PBS.

Medicines Australia will continue to engage both with Roxon and other ministers including the Prime Minister because "this is a whole community issue," he said.

"It's very disappointing and hard to believe that in a country as prosperous as Australia we cannot afford to give medicines to people who need them," he added.

AHPRA site relaunch

THE Australian Health
Practitioners Regulation Agency has
today launched the first phase of a
new look website "as part of a
program of work to improve its
services to health practitioners and
the community".

Key enhancements include new online services including a facility which allows tracking of renewal applications.

The revamped site also features a powerful new search engine to help locate relevant information across the AHPRA and National Board websites, as well as providing easy links to online renewal facilities.

AHPRA ceo Martin Fletcher said the organisation was working hard to help practitioners understand and meet their responsibilities under the new National Scheme, "and the website upgrade and other service improvements are part of that commitment."

The site also now allows large scale employers to "bulk check" the registration status of their staff, while Fletcher said AHPRA had changed its customer service processes so that phone calls are now being "managed directly by experienced staff in local AHPRA offices wherever possible".

The agency also has further enhancements under way, including a facility which will allow registrants to print a copy of their certificates online.

Fletcher said work was also under way to allow practitioners and employers to check the process of registration applications, similar to the existing service already available for registration renewals.

3G pill warnings

AN article in this month's *British Medical Journal* suggests that "third generation" oral contraceptives containing drospirenone should not be the first choice for prescribers.

The report cites a study of women aged 15 to 44 and identified a higher risk of venous thromboembolism among those who used the new type of pill.

Fexofenadine rescheduling?

THE Advisory Committee on Medicines Scheduling has recommended that Telfast be exempt from scheduling, according to the details of the committee's interim decisions published by the TGA earlier this week (PD Wed).

The proposal is that the current Schedule 2 entry for the oral form of the medication be exempted from scheduling for the "short term symptomatic relief of seasonal allergic rhinitis".

The down-scheduling would apply to packs of ten dosage units or less, for the treatment of adults and children aged 12 years or over, packs containing not more than five days supply, and a maximum daily dose of 120mg.

If approved the move would see Telfast available for supermarket sale after the recommended implementation date of 01 Sep.

The committee also considered the inclusion of a warning statement on the packaging for fexofenadine warning that it should not be used with other antihistamines, and is also not recommended for use when pregnant or when breastfeeding "except when advised by your Doctor or Pharmacist".

The proposed move follows a submission by Telfast's manufacturer which included a survey showing that only 4% of pharmacies operate 24 hours/7 days a week "indicating an unmet demand for access to fexofenadine from grocery outlets".

Age is vital to vaccine

THE Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine is most effective when administered to girls aged between 12 and 13 years, according to the Royal College of Pathologists Australasia.

"The younger they have the vaccine, the better it is as their immune system is stronger and they have a better immune response," said Director of Cytology at Douglass Hanly Moir Pathology in Sydney, Dr Annabelle Farnsworth.

Chevaz however was not dissuaded from her goal, telling media that she had another anonymous donor flying her back to Britain where she had now organised accommodation - and is hoping to at least be able to stand around somewhere outside the church before tonight's nuptials.

A 43-year old Austrian paraglider, Wolfgang Dorner, got the fright of his life this week, after a gust of wayward wind blew him off his course and got him snagged at the top of a police observation tower.
