As well as clinical updates, Australia's biggest pharmacy trade show and workshops on business and professional services, attendees discussed major issues facing the industry.

A strong theme was the recent move to direct distribution by Pfizer (*PD* Fri) and the consequent impacts on the three full line wholesalers, as well as last month's govt backflip which has seen the new requirement of Cabinet approval for all new PBS drugs.

The Pharmacy Guild announced a number of significant initiatives, while suppliers released lots of new products and the industry partied together in a fabulous gala dinner on Saturday night featuring Jimmy Barnes along with an auction to help the Guild Disaster Appeal.

Ibuprofen-K response

RECKITT Benckiser has responded to a *Medical Journal of Australia* article which links ibuprofen use to potassium deficiency.

RB said the conclusions drawn by the researchers were based on just four patients taking up to 50 tablets of ibuprofen a day, and that the findings should not be confused with occasional use of OTC ibuprofen for the short-term relief of pain.

The Pharmacies of the Year

THE Australian pharmacy sector honoured some of its best and brightest on the weekend, with the naming yesterday of the winners of the QCPP Pharmacy of the Year award at APP on the Gold Coast.

This year the competition offered awards in three categories:
Excellence in Business Management, won by John Bronger ChemistWorks from Wetherill Park, NSW;
Innovation in Professional Services,

taken out by Pharmacy 777 from Whitford City, WA; and Excellence in Community Engagement, won by Orana Mall Pharmacy in Dubbo, Western NSW.

Orana Mall Pharmacy was named the overall winner of the Pharmacy of the Year Award, with judges citing its strength across all three categories "particularly in its service linkages with local health providers and liaison with other health professionals".

"This competition celebrates the very high

standards of service achieved by Australian pharmacies who are accredited under the Quality Care Pharmacy Program," said Guild National President Kos Sclavos.

"The winners are shining examples of the strength of the community pharmacy model".

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

The benefits of connecting to a centralised IT system

For many independent pharmacists, the effort to keep the product administration of their I.T. system up to date is tiresome, and costs money in administrative effort and lost opportunity.

However, it must be done, as files coming down from service providers and vendors become out of date so quickly.

This is where an independent pharmacist can really benefit from being connected to a centralised I.T. system.

The head office team manages all the product files from suppliers and vendors and downloads clean product file information directly into the pharmacy's POS system.

This means:

- New products are categorised into the correct departments and categories for reporting.
- Stock card maintenance is done centrally for you, including bar code changes and product description changes
- · Generic deals are loaded and maintained with the correct discounts.
- Minimum order quantities for deals are automatically updated
- Catalogue promotions and promotional pricing can be automated and downloaded to your POS, and these can be electronically customised for the specific store.

An added bonus is that the sales data can be collected from your pharmacy, and used to report on your performance across various categories (and benchmarked against other pharmacies).

The data can also show you

whether you are making the most of generics, and where your opportunities for growth are.



Buying a pharmacy easier

A NEW initiative soft-launched at APP aims to assist new entrants into pharmacy businesses.

Dubbed 'New Pharma', the program was inspired by the work of the late Judy Liauw who was chair of the Women and Young Pharmacists' Committee.

The Guild said that New Pharma was "the realisation of her desire to provide access to the right information in a simple and logical format for all young pharmacists considering ownership".

New Pharma is an online diagnostic program to help prospective owners avoid pitfalls that exist in purchasing a pharmacy.

Launching the program, a Guild statement said that it "hopes that the development of New Pharma will see many more pharmacists become owners and prevent situations where young pharmacists are attracted into partnerships where they have little equity or influence in the business."

It's been designed by industry experts and successful proprietors "exclusively for potential pharmacy owners." with registrations of interest now open at a special website www.newpharma.org.au.

The toolkit, including 12 months website access, costs \$330.

5CPA R&D RFT

THE Pharmacy Guild has issued requests for tenders for the Research and Development program as part of the Fifth Community Pharmacy Agreement.

There's up to \$10.6m in funding available in the R&D program which aims to maintain and improve the health outcomes of Australians through evidence based best practice on issues related to Pharmacv.

Six topic areas have been identified: Consumer Needs; Mental Illness; Rural Pharmacy Workforce; Health Literacy; Professional Integration; and Chronic Illness.

Canadian robots

THE government of the Canadian province of Ontario has announced the rollout of automatic drug dispensing machines in remote and rural communities, after the implementation of regulations allowing for prescriptions to be filled without the physical presence of a pharmacist, according to the Toronto Star.

The systems are similar to ATMs, and include a live connection to a pharmacist who can interact with patients after they insert their prescription into the machine.

The devices are made by a firm called PharmaTrust, with up to 40 to be installed across Ontario over the next six months.

Narcotics will not be available at the remote dispensing locations, and pharmacies wishing to operate a "remote kiosk" must be fully accredited by the Ontario College of Pharmacists.



FRED Health ceo Paul Naismith is taking a leaf out of Charlie Sheen's book, to help promote electronic prescribing for Australian pharmacists.

In a panel discussion at APP on Friday morning, Naismith urged more uptake of the eRx Script Exchange system, because it will enable eRx to reinvest in further solutions for the industry.

Citing the Twitter rants of "internet philosopher" Sheen, Naismith suggested that "every time you do an e-script, think of yourself as putting Tiger Blood into the system".

AND during the same discussion at APP, Pfizer managing director John Latham issued a robust defence of the company's decision to sell direct.

He said that if Pfizer was forced to continue to use the full line wholesalers - who have their own alliances with generic makers - it would be similar to "selling Pepsi but being told to do it via the Coca Cola distributor".
