Senate to investigate S100

THE supply of PBS medicines by remote Aboriginal Health Services (AHS) is set to be the focus of a new probe by the Senate Community Affairs Reference Committee.

The Senate agreed to the move last week, with the investigation set to focus on the special arrangements under Section 100 of the Health Act which have allowed the bulk provision of medicines to remote Indigenous Australians for the last decade without the oversight of pharmacists (PD 22 Mar).

Guild gets e-health

GUILD-owned company Fred IT Group's Medview project has been selected as one of nine lead implementation sites for the Govt's second wave e-health rollout.

Yesterday Health Minister Nicola Roxon announced the move, which will test the roll-out of electronic health records

Fred's Medview project will allow clinicians to see a combined list of prescribed and dispensed medications regardless of how many doctors and pharmacies a patient has attended.

Initially Medview will be deployed to all pharmacies and GPs in the Geelong (Vic) region, as well as a targeted further 10% of pharmacies and GP's across Australia.

Partners in the Fred IT MedView project also include the PSA, Monash University, Geelong General Practice Association and several other software vendors.

develop its own pharmaceutical care program and there is no electronic recording of drugs dispensed, with hand-written labels usually the "norm".

"Mainstream Australians have access to a pharmacist (by law) in every pharmacy in Australia when a PBS prescription is dispensed," said Pharmacy Consultant Rollo Manning said.

"No such facility is available to an Aboriginal patient of an AHS," he said, urging that "the involvement of pharmacists in this process should be a leading principle" ..

The scope of the Senate inquiry will include the clinical outcomes achieved by the measure, the degree to which the quality use of medicines has been achieved, distribution funding, labelling and monitoring of medications, and "access to PBS generally in remote communities".

Priceline flu vax move

PRICELINE is set to launch a flu vaccination program next week across its 120 pharmacies nationwide.

It's understood that the scheme will allow patients to make an appointment to see a nurse inpharmacy for a \$30 flu jab.

Pharmacy immunisation is set to receive lots more attention in the coming weeks, with incoming NSW health spokesperson, Jillian Skinner promising before last weekend's election that if elected the Coalition Government would consider proposals to give pharmacists a more active role in vaccination programs.
