Aussie arthritis sufferers

OVER one third of Australians aged over 45 are unable to exercise as much as they would like, according to a new survey undertaken by Deep Heat Naturals.

According to Arthritis Australia currently around 3.85 million Australians suffer from Arthritis, and one in five suffers from chronic pain.

Cold sores on Valentine's

A NEW study published in The Journal of Drugs and Dermatology is giving hope to Aussie cold sore sufferers, after it revealed a new treatment can significantly reduce burning, stinging, acute pain, blistering and skin redness more effectively than existing treatments.

The study compared the efficacy and tolerability of a single use, topical formulation containing copper sulfate pentahydrate and hypericum perforaturn (marketed as Dynamiclear) to a topical 5% acyclovir cream standard preparation and use, and found that the odds for being affected by burning and stinging sensation were 1.9 times greater in the acyclovir group, compared to the Dynamiclear group.

Researchers also found that the odds of being affected by symptoms of acute pain, erythema and vesiculation were 1.8, 2.4 and 4.4 times higher in the acvclovir group in comparison to the Dynamiclear group.

"In contrast, fit over 45s are striding ahead with their lives walking, swimming and going to the gym - creating a gulf between the fit and the sick," Deep Heat Naturals said in a statement.

The survey also found topical treatments, such as Deep Heat, were among the main products used by over 45s, whilst figures from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare found that more than one half of all osteoarthritis sufferers take some form of natural product or complementary therapy for their arthritis pain relief.

Progress on controlled drugs

The Federal Government has announced progress in the Fifth Community Pharmacy Agreement project to develop a national recording system for controlled drugs.

The go-ahead for a system developed in Tasmania has been welcomed by the Pharmacy Guild.

National President Kos Sclavos said real time monitoring of controlled drugs has been a priority for the Guild for many years and this is a major reason why the Guild negotiated funding for this important project in the Community Pharmacy Agreement.

This initiative will save lives and it will allow early intervention with patients who are having trouble with controlled drugs.

The Guild will work with Government to allay any privacy concerns patients may have with the initiative.

The Guild will also work with the Government to ensure the IT integration of this project does not create administrative and technical difficulties for pharmacists.

This is a good example of the benefits that are flowing to Australian health care consumers through the Fifth Agreement.

Community pharmacists want every step taken to maximise the quality use of medicines, and discourage abuse.

New Alzheimer's drug hope

RESEARCHERS in the US are boosting the hopes of Alzheimer's sufferers worldwide, with the results of their study which showed bexarotene's promise in correcting the pathological, cognitive and memory deficits caused by the disease in mice.

Published in Science, the study found that bexarotene, a skin

Ovarian Cancer's KISS

OVARIAN Cancer Australia has launched a new KISS campaign, aimed at getting women to Know the Important Signs and Symptoms of ovarian cancer, and to ultimately help them get diagnosed and start appropriate treatment as soon as possible.

"It's concerning that 60% of women are unaware there is no early detection test for ovarian cancer," said Paula Benson, Ovarian Cancer Australia Chair.

"Unfortunately, three out of four cases of ovarian cancer are advanced at the time of diagnosis, meaning the outcomes for women are generally poor," she added.

The four most frequently reported symptoms for ovarian cancer include: abdominal or pelvic pain, increased abdominal size or persistent abdominal bloating, need to urinate often or urgently and difficulty eating or feeling full quickly.

cancer drug, cleared accumulations of the amyloid-beta protein in mice, which is associated with impaired learning and memory functions in Alzheimer's patients, in a matter of days.

Following dosage with the drug, mice with Alzheimer's-like symptoms experienced improved cognitive function for up to three months (after which the scientists stopped monitoring), as well as improved social

functionality and sense of smell.

"This is a particularly exciting and rewarding study because of the new science we have discovered and the potential promise of a therapy for Alzheimer's disease," said lead author of the study, Dr Gary Landreth, a neuroscientist at Case Western Reserve University.

"We need to be clear - the drug works quite well in mouse models of the disease.

"Our next objective is to ascertain if it acts similarly in humans," he added.

Means test fairness

THE Govt is defending its stance on means-testing for private health insurance saying it is designed to bring about fairness for taxpayers.

"It is not fair for low and middle income earning Australians to be subsidising the health insurance of households with incomes of more than \$250,000 a year," said Health Minister Tanya Plibersek.
