Address antibiotic issues

EFFECTIVE communication between healthcare professionals and their patients can reduce the antibiotic demand for self-limiting conditions like respiratory tract infections, and as such, help to reduce the levels of individual- and community-based antibiotic resistance, according to NPS.

The statement comes on the back of its newly launched antibiotics campaign (PD 01 Feb) which is designed to help stem the rising tide of antibiotic resistance.

"Many patients are unaware of the issues surrounding antibiotic resistance and how it can affect them, their friends and family," said NPS Clinical Adviser

Mental health in SA

HEALTH Authorities in SA are launching a new campaign aimed at breaking down discrimination and stigma associated with mental illness through a new 'Let's Think Positive Campaign'.

The campaign includes a series of thought-provoking TV, radio, online and outdoor ads which will "challenge common assumptions about mental illness".

"This campaign's intended to get people thinking about how our actions, attitudes and language can really affect others," said SA Mental Health Minister, John Hill.

"One in five of us will be affected by mental illness this year and we want to shine a light on the stigmatisation and discrimination that can accompany it," he added.

"Prescribing an antibiotic now, for infections that resolve without drug treatment, means that antibiotics are likely to be less effective for them when they need to treat a severe infection in the future," she said.

Adding to the patient safety benefits of explaining issues surrounding the misuse or overuse of antibiotics to patients, Stowasser said that there is evidence to suggest that patient satisfaction is more likely to be influenced by good communication over prescribing an antibiotic.
