PRIYA Sumithran from the University of Melbourne has won the Bupa Health Foundation **Emerging Health Researcher Award** this year for her research into obesity and weight management.

Sunithran's research saw her discover that the difficulty in maintaining weight loss is most likely caused by lasting changes in the "set point" of the satiety/ appetite mechanisms in the brain.

This more or less determines the weight to which dieters will return to after losing weight.

Tasmania gives organs

TASMANIANS are donating their organs at the highest rates ever, thanks to the Royal Hobart Hospital. According to the figures, the year to date has seen 55 organs donated.

The Tasmanian Minister for health, Michelle O'Byrne, is lauding the Royal Hobart Hospital and DonateLife TAS network staff for their "continued and committed effort to increase family consent rates through the delivery of a professional clinical and medical program".

MEANWHILE, discussing national organ donation, the Parliamentary Secretary for Health and Ageing Catherine King, said that the message is getting out, with 77% of Australians having now discussed their donation wishes with family members.

Despite this, around 40% of families say no to organ donation, in part because they don't know if their loved one wants to be a donor.

THE key to tackling the pipeline slowage for antibiotic development lies in collaboration between worldwide industry bodies and governments, according to

Medicines Australia. "The problem of anti-microbial resistance requires a collaborative response, bringing together leaders in government, science, economics,

public policy and industry," said Medicines Australia Chief Executive Dr Brendan Shaw. "The medicines industry shares

the concerns of the World Health Organisation about the global spread of anti-microbial resistance.

"Without new effective antibiotics, many complex medical interventions like chemotherapy, joint replacements and organ transplants would be very difficult or impossible," Shaw added.

Speaking about the issue, Shaw urged governments around the world to work with the medicines industry and other parties to create a policy environment "that will prevent and counter the emergence of highly resistant infections".

"The result is while the medicines industry has invested billions of dollars in developing new medicines over the last two decades, antibiotics are one area where companies have exited the market," he added.


