CSIRO has flu breakthrough

SCIENTISTS at Australia's CSIRO may have arrived at a solution to safeguard the nation against epidemic and pandemic flu strains.

The breakthrough development is the result of collaboration between the CSIRO, the University of British Columbia and the University of Bath, which resulted in the creation of a drug that has been proven to be effective in preventing the spread of different strains of influenza in laboratory models - including resistant strains of the virus.

"In order to infect cells, flu viruses bind onto sugars on the cell surface," the researchers said.

"To be able to spread they need to remove these sugars.

Corum profit surge

PHARMACY software supplier Corum Group has reported its results for the six months to 31 Dec, with after-tax profit improving 32.15 to \$3.371 million.

Revenue was unchanged from the previous corresponding period at \$10.87 million, with the Corum Health Services software division producing a \$1.82m operating profit - a huge improvement on the previous result of \$119,000 which included a non-recurring expense of \$968,000 for impairment of software development costs.

"All segments of this division improved compared to last year," the company said.

Corum's directors have announced the declaration of an unfranked dividend of .6 cents per ordinary share. preventing the virus from removing sugars and blocking the virus from infecting more cells.

"It is hoped the drug will also be effective against future strains of the virus," the researchers added.

In addition, CSIRO scientist Dr Jenny McKimm-Breschkin, said that as the site where the drug binds is found in all flu strains, the new drug is expected to be effective even against future flu strains.

It is unlikely however that the Australian public will see the antiviral drug anytime in the near future, with researchers estimating that it will take up to seven years before the drug is released.

An end to insulin pens?

HOSPITALS in the US are being advised to move away from routinely using insulin pens on diabetic patients, following the possible exposure of 700 patients to HIV, hepatitis B and hepatitis C in a New York hospital.

The exposure was due to the reuse of insulin pens on multiple patients after a change of disposable needle.

"All it takes is one or two individuals who are not aware that it is unsafe to place a new disposable needle on a pen used for one patient and use it to deliver a dose of insulin to another patient," the Institute said.

"Completely controlling for this is difficult, perhaps even impossible, given that unsafe pen use has persisted despite educational efforts and monitoring," the Institute added.

Health is a priority for Oz

AUSTRALIANS care more about their health than careers and financial security, according to the *OPSM Future Vision Report*.

Commissioned by OPSM, the study was conducted among 1,035 Australians aged 18 years and over, and found that when asked about what they value, nine out of ten placed their health above their career, whilst more than three

quarters valued health over

financial security.

The report also found that Aussies are fairly optimistic about the future of healthcare, with 64% saying that they believe that healthcare will only improve further.

When asked about vision health, 94% said that wanting to see the world using their own eyes will always be important, whilst almost four in five (78%) Australians agree that improvements in technology mean they get to see more of the future than they otherwise would have

Interestingly, when asked to look 80 years into the future around changes in consumer products, Aussies want to see innovations like glasses that increase vision or allow people to see in the dark being offered, ahead of things like invisibility cloaks and non-melting ice.

Laying awake at night listening to the shrill buzz of a tiny vampire as it advances and retreats, many may wonder whether mosquitoes do in fact have some form of dark super power.

Well it now seems as if some do. Scientists researching Queensland's Aeses aegypti subset species of mosquito have determined that they do in fact have a very unfortunate superpower, that of being the ability to adapt to insect repellant.

The research, published in *PLOS ONE*, found that whilst the Aeses mozzie was at first repelled by N,N-diethyl-meta-toluamide (DEET), after a mere three hours it was able to adapt to the smell and was able to return for a bite of dinner.

The study, whilst nightmarish for those who think a quick spray and a citronella candle will protect them from the irritating buzzing which announces a mozzie's arrival at a BBQ, has more worrying implications, being that the Aeses breed is known to be a major carrier of Dengue fever.
