## TGA seeks new advisors

**THE** Therapeutic Goods Administration has issued a call for expressions of interest from experts on a number of its key advisory committees.

More than 50 advisors are being sought from a range of fields, with the appointments expected to commence in early 2014 for a period of up to three years.

Places are available on Advisory Committees in areas including Biologicals, Medical Devices, Complementary Medicines, Prescription Medicines, Non-Prescription Medicines, the Safety

Expressions of interest will be valid for 12 months and also may be used, if suitable, to fill unexpected committee vacancies and may also be put forward for other TGA expert committees.

Remuneration and travel for all TGA statutory advisory committees is in accordance with the latest Remuneration Tribunal determinations, and members are bound by committee-in-confidence obligations, as well as obligations to declare all potential conflicts of interest.

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#### National relay service

THE launch of the new National Relay Service will help enhance communication options for people in the community, with new services available including a video relay service which will enable deaf Australians to communicate using sign language.

There's also a new SMS relay service which enables deaf, hearing and speech impaired Australians to send an SMS from a standard mobile phone through the National Relay Service and to another party.

Additional new services will roll out later in the year, including a two-way internet relay; a webbased captioned telephony service; and an application for mobile devices to provide easy access to a range of NRS services.

Stuart Stubbs, Guild Insurance Head of Client Services, said the move was important "as it now means pharmacists have access to rapid response critical incident counselling for anyone affected by a traumatic event connected with their business.

"It also covers counselling services for anyone not eligible for cover under Workers' Compensation," Stubbs said.

The change, which is effective immediately for existing policies, means that pharmacists now also receive cover for the cost of a replacement pharmacist if the pharmacy owner insured on the policy is affected by the incident; an increase in the limit of cover to \$2500 per claim per location; and all pharmacy staff including contractors will now be covered.

**EFFECTIVE** 01 Jul 2013 the application fee waiver for TGA reclassification applications ceased to apply.

Class III application fees are now \$1,180, and Class IIb annual charges (\$920 at 2013-14 rate) continue to apply while there is a Class IIb entry in the ARTG even if a product has been successfully reclassified as a Class III medical device.

#### **COMPULSORY** caring.

BBC News reports from Beijing that a new law which came into effect this week compels children in China to visit their parents or potentially face fines or jail.

China's new "Elderly Rights Law" deals with the growing problem of lonely elderly people by mandating that adult children must visit their ageing parents.

The law says adults should care about their parents' "spiritual needs" and "never neglect or snub elderly people".

The regulation has been ridiculed by tens of thousands of Chinese web users.

Many across China are questioning how the law could be enforced, since it fails to spell out a detailed schedule dictating the frequency with which children should make parental house calls.

Like many countries China is facing a major ageing problem in its population, with the number of citizens aged 60 or older predicted to double to almost 400 million by 2030.

PHARMACY robbery is the pits.
A thief who used Telstra pit
covers to smash his way into five
NSW pharmacies has had his
original sentence increased after
an appeal.

Mark John Grover pleaded guilty to six counts of breaking into pharmacies (once using a block of bricks) and stealing quantities of pseudoephedrine-containing products, between 18 February 2010 and 23 November 2010, when he was sentenced at the District Court of NSW in September 2012.

He also admitted two charges of using a false driver's licence to obtain medicines from pharmacies that contained pseudoephedrine, and one count of attempted use of a false documentation.

He was originally given a "head sentence" of five years; this has now been increased to seven years and three months.
