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'Plan B' OTC in USA

THE US Food and Drug Administration has approved Plan B One-Step levonorgestrel emergency contraception for over-the-counter availability without a prescription.

In 2011 the sponsor of Plan B One-Step, Teva Pharmaceuticals, applied to make the product available OTC for all females of reproductive age, but this was not approved by the FDA.

An amended application imposed the 15-year-old age minimum and now that this has been approved the product will be labelled not for sale to those under 15 years of age *proof of age required* not for sale where age cannot be verified.

The product will also be security tagged to prevent theft, and Teva will also make the product available in retail outlets with an onsite pharmacy, "where it generally will be available in the family planning of female health aisles".

Teva said it also plans to educate consumers, pharmacy staff and health care professionals about the product's new OTC status.

UAE licensing simpler

THE government of the United Arab Emirates this week revamped its procedures for the licensing and monitoring of pharmacies and pharmacists, which will mean they only need to obtain a sanction from a single state government authority rather than the current requirements for three licenses.

From 01 June the 600 pharmacies in Dubai, along with pharmacists and pharmacy assistants, will have to be registered with the Dubai Health Authority rather than the UAE Ministry of Health.

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Participating practices can receive clinical reports which identify areas for improvement, with the roll-out being staged to ensure compatibility with the wide range of GP environments as well as a strong focus on guaranteeing patient and doctor confidentiality.

NPS ceo Lynn Weekes said that the program will next move into South Australia and NSW, with plans to also implement it in Queensland, Tasmania, Western Australia and the Northern Territory in the near future.

Once the program is implemented "we'll then have a really clear picture of medicine use and prescribing across Australia, including the areas where we can do better," Weekes said.

IMS getting social

IMS Health has announced the acquisition of Semantelli Corporation, which is a New Jersey based social media analytics company, with the move aiming to extend IMS' marketing and consumer engagement capabilities for healthcare organisations across the globe.

Semantelli offers a "robust set of cloud-based tools" which automate the collection of healthcare-specific social media content.

This enables real-time monitoring for "reputation and opportunity management" as well as delivering extensive insight into consumer and physician behaviour and sentiments.

EMA to publish clinical trials data

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THE European Medicines Agency has committed to the "proactive publication of data from clinical trials," as part of its ongoing push to increase transparency.

The move follows a workshop last Nov to gather feedback from a range of stakeholders.

Following the workshop participants were invited to join consultation groups set up to advise on five areas: protecting patient confidentiality, clinical trial data formats, rules of engagement, good analysis practice, and legal aspects of the move.

The final proposal is that trial data supporting the authorisation of medicines will be published once the marketing authorisation process has ended, and which the EMA does not consider to be commercially confidential.

"The release of data is ultimately about establishing trust and confidence in the system," an official statement said.

The next step is to draft a formal policy which will be subject to consultation, with the final outcome expected to come into force on 01 Jan 2014.

Souvenaid from Mon

DISPENSARY CORNER

AIRCRAFT passengers shouldn't make any big decisions while they're in the air, according to an eminent academic in the UK.

David Gradwell from King's College London is Britain's first professor of aerospace medicine, and at a media conference this week gave health advice to travellers, such as how to avoid jet lag and dehydration.

But he also pointed out that according to recent studies learning is a bit impaired at high altitude, along with performance of recently learned tasks.

"It's perhaps not where you want to make the most important decision of your life," he said.
