"It is part of the normal work of the Audit Office, and there is no reason why anyone would have imagined that a \$15 billion Agreement would not be subject to the scrutiny of the Auditor-General," Turnbull told PD.

He said the Guild hoped that any findings will "contribute to an even better Agreement, with even better outcomes for health consumers".

Union group Professional Pharmacists Australia also welcomed the probe, taking the opportunity to reiterate previous comments about a "lack of transparency" in the 5CPA.

"We have long argued for a better pharmacy agreement that creates profitable pharmacies but also delivers better outcomes to patients and pharmacists," said PPA president, Geoff March.

Interestingly, just last week NT pharmacist Rollo Manning urged the ANAO to request a Productivity Commission enquiry into the 5CPA (PD 22 May) urging an investigation into the value of dispensing fees.

Symbion-Ebos deal?

SYMBION Pharmacy Services is reportedly considering a possible merger with New-Zealand's Ebos Group, with the combined operations to be run by Symbion ceo Patrick Davies.

According to a report in today's *Financial Review*, investors have been asked about investing in the combined entity in the lead-up to a listing on the Australian Stock Exchange.

Merchant bank UBS is advising Ebos and has suggested a capital raising underwritten by a \$90m share placement and a \$150m rights issue.

Ebos is publicly listed in NZ and has a range of operations including Ebos Healthcare, which distributes health products in Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Fiji and the Pacific Islands.

Ebos also owns the Masterpet Group animal care business.

Symbion Pharmacy Services is owned by Hong Kong-based Zuellig Group, which bought the pharmacy business after Primary Health acquired Symbion Health in 2008.

Pharmaxis to slash staff

PHARMACEUTICAL research firm Pharmaxis yesterday announced a staff reduction of around 30%, after a major review of the business following "recent regulatory and clinical trial setbacks".

The revised plan "delivers significant reductions in expenses and increases the focus on partnering strategies" to reposition the company for the future in the global respiratory drug market.

Partnership opportunities for Bronchitol will be sought in the US for cystic fibrosis, and globally for bronchiectasis, while the company will retain a direct commercial interest in Bronchitol in Europe and other approved and reimbursed markets for the product.

Staff numbers will be cut across the board from 155 to 110 by 31 Dec, saving about \$12 million per annum and resulting in restructuring costs of \$2 million which will be booked in 2012/13. Pharmaxis said it would manage

Chairman Malcolm McComas said the failure of the company to achieve regulatory milestones meant that 2013 would be a "year of restructure.

"I believe we have a clear plan and a viable way forward," he said.

RACP on Vitamin D

THE Royal College of Pathologists of Australia yesterday released a new position statement on the use and interpretation of vitamin D testing in Australia.

RCPA president Professor Yee Khong said the organisation recommends that vitamin D testing is not conducted or recommended as routine screening.

"The testing of healthy individuals will reveal a significant subgroup with low 25OH-D levels," he said.

"This leads to treatment and perpetuates repeat testing, without information as to whether such patients will benefit from vitamin D supplementation".

Khong said that as the main source of vitamin D is UVB sunlight exposure, levels are correlated with time spent outdoors, exercise and other aspects of a healthy lifestyle.

"For healthy adults, infants and pregnant women, we do not curently recommend routine screening".

The RACP also said that high dose annual replacement of Vitamin D should be discouraged, "as two studies have been published with significant results demonstrating harm" with this type of Vitamin D supplementation.

Pneumococcal vaccine

THE incidence of pneumococcal disease in Australia has been substantially reduced by universal vaccination of young children and older adults, according to an update from Australian Prescriber.

Universal immunisation for the disease was introduced in 2005, resulting in good "herd immunity".

Pharmacy PCEHR error

A GLITCH in procedures at a community pharmacy has been cited as the most likely cause of a problem where a Personally Controlled Electronic Health Record incorrectly had two wrong prescriptions added to it.

Kate McDonald, a writer at *Pulse IT* magazine, found that the scripts had been added to her PCEHR in Feb - for drugs which had never been prescribed for her and for conditions she does not have.

An investigation by the Dept of Human Services found that the prescriptions had been dispensed from her regular pharmacy - but the problem was compounded when repeats were ordered from a different pharmacy, which she had never been to.

It appears that the initial scripts were linked to the wrong PCEHR when dispensed.

STRESS is no excuse for a chocolate binge, according to researchers from the University of Southern California, who found that being under pressure can reinforce both good and bad behavioural patterns.

Reported in the latest Journal of Personality and Social Psychology, a study looked at the activities of 65 students over a 10 week term and measured the amount of willpower subjects had during the stressful exam period.

They found that during trying times, when participants were stressed and sleep-deprived, they were even more likely to stick to old habits, reports the BBC.

Thus the students who ate lots of junk food had an even worse diet during exams, while those who went to the gym regularly were even more likely to exercise while under pressure.

"The central question for behaviour-change efforts should be, how can you form healthy, productive habits," said lead scientist, Professor Wendy Wood.

NECESSITY is the mother of invention, and a great example of this is a Chinese man who has built his own prosthetic limbs, after losing both arms in a freak accident eight years ago when a fishing boat exploded.

According to the UK Telegraph, Sun Jifa was unable to afford medical help from local hospitals, and has spent the time since the incident crafting his custom designed arms out of steel.

After refining the design he's now able to drive, perform routine tasks and help his family out on the local farm.

The report says the farmer has now become a minor celebrity in his home town, and is now reasonably prosperous, having started a business which has created more than 1000 pairs of prosthetic limbs for other amputees - and sold them at about a tenth of the price charged by Chinese hospitals.
