Genzyme 'Gong ride

GENZYME, a Sanofi Company, has put together one of its biggest ever teams for this year's MS Australia Sydney to the Gong Ride which aims to help raise money to support people living with Multiple Sclerosis.

30 members comprising Genzyme staff, friends, family and customers will collectively ride almost 3,000km, with 2013 being the 8th consecutive year that Genzyme/Sanofi have entered a team.

Collectively they have raised more than \$110,000 for the cause, including \$27,000 in 2012.

Genzyme md and ride participant Robert Hendriks said this year the fundraising target is \$20,000 "and we would welcome anyone in the industry who would like to donate to our cause or even join our team".

New NCPA President

THE US National Community
Pharmacists Association (NCPA)
has announced the appointment of
Mark Riley as its new President.

Riley is currently executive vice president of the Arkansas Pharmacists Association and owns a community pharmacy in Little Rock, Arkansas.

He's also an expert on the American pharmacy benefit manager industry.

The move was announced during the NCPA conference, where members also voted in favour of a number of resolutions relating to challenges facing the sector such as compounding, taxation inequities, specialty pharmacies and the transfer of independent pharmacies from one owner to another.

United GPs slam PCEHR

DOCTORS groups from across Australia have urged the new government to address what they say are major issues with the Personally Controlled Electronic Health Record, saying that the Department of Health is not listening to the concerns of people actually using the system.

United General Practice Australia issued a statement saying there is currently no alignment between registration of consumers and actual meaningful use of the system through engagement of the clinical community and assurance of improvement of health outcomes.

In Aug a number of key "clinical leads" resigned from the National E-Health Transition Authority, amid "ongoing concerns and requests for NEHTA and DoHA to review the PCEHR development cycle".

More new AusPARs

AUSTRALIAN Public Assessment Reports have been released for three more therapies, with the TGA website now including AusPARS for Zaltrap/Aflitiv/Lidaveg (aflibercept), Daivobet 50/500 (calcipotriol and betamethasone) and Cinryze (C1 esterase inhibitor).

Kombiglyze XR

A NEW once-daily fixed dose combination therapy to improve glycemic control has been approved for use by adults with type 2 diabetes in Australia, with the registration of Kombiglyze XR which combines the mechanism of action of Onglyza (saxagliptin) with extended release metformin.

"E-Health and the PCEHR have the potential to transform Australia's health system and provide superior, safer and more efficient healthcare" the groups said, adding that this will only occur if clinicians have input and there is full secure messaging interoperability.

Prior to the election, new health minister Peter Dutton flagged a review of the PCEHR system, with the doctors' groups saying they look forward to contributing.

Locum app released

A NEW smartphone app for pharmacy recruitment has been released by The Pharmaceutical Locum Company.

It is now available for free download on iPhone, iPad, Android devices and tablets.

J&J sales surge

JOHNSON & Johnson has seen a healthy 9.9% increase in sales of prescription drugs during the three months to 30 Sep.

J&J's Total prescription drug sales amounted to US\$7 billion, with the performance led by demand for items such as Remicade, Velcade, Stelara, Simponi and Zytiga.

The more you use, the more you lose

WHEN it comes to weight loss, a new randomized controlled trial conducted by Baylor College of Medicine researchers and published online in *The American Journal of Medicine* found that overweight and obese adults following a community-based weight loss intervention, namely Weight Watchers, lost significantly more weight than those who tried to lose weight on their own (10.1 lbs. vs. 1.3 lbs. at six months).

Those following Weight Watchers were 8x more likely to reach a 5% weight loss and the best results were achieved by those using meetings, mobile apps and online tools.

Covad secures funding

PHARMACY-BASED health insurance provider Covad has a new Executive Chairman after successfully completing a round of venture capital raising.

Izak Pretorius, who's a security entrepeneur, industrialist, former South African Businessman of the Year and now Australian resident, is taking on the role after making a "substantial long term commitment" to the Covad business and its founder and md Anthony Huxley.

Covad, which is the first ever private health aggregator to leverage the "bricks and mortar pharmacy channel," (*PD* 30 Aug) will launch its consumer site at the end of the month via pharmacies across Australia.

Huxley said that Covad will debut in close to 100 locations, followed by a paced rollout of over 1,000 sites activated progressively across the next twelve months.

"We're pacing the rate of site activation because we're committed to setting an industry benchmark," Huxley said.

"We've communicated that to

regulators, providers, pharmacies and consumers and we're sticking to it...we're forecasting as many as 50% of total retail pharmacy sites being onboard within three years".

Pretorius said that after looking closely at well over 100 investment proposals, mainly start-ups, he was attracted to the Covad business because "they're not just transforming the delivery of health cover, they're building a really viable future for pharmacy too".
