IMS to buy Cegedim

US HEALTHCARE information company IMS Health Holdings Inc. has announced its intention to buy elements of the Cegedim software business for about \$520m.

Financing the deal will be via a combination of cash and existing credit facilities with TPG Capital Management and is expected to be settled early next year.

US chemo controversy

THE US Food and Drug Administration has successfully prosecuted a case involving the sale of unapproved chemotherapy drugs, with an oncology practice and its manager pleading guilty in the case this week.

Hematology and Oncology Center was investigated by the FDA after it obtained "substantial amounts of chemotherapy drugs" from Quality Special Products, a foreign drug distributor in Canada.

The medications were obtained from Turkey, India and the EU, following an earlier civil settlement agreed to by the practice and its managers in which they paid US\$2 million "to resolve charges that they violated the False Claims Act."



Broccoli breathing

EATING one to two cups of lightly steamed broccoli a day could help asthmatics to breathe normally and prevent their condition from worsening, University of Melbourne research has found.

The study found that consuming vegetables from the cruciferous family which also includes kale, cabbage, brussel sprouts, cauliflower and bok choy, can reduce and even reverse lung damage.

The research, led by honours student Nadia Mazarakis could change the treatment for people who suffer from asthma and other breathing complaints.

"Laboratory tests have shown that consumption of broccoli changes the formation of the airway and may make clear breathing easier for those who suffer from asthma and allergies," said Mazarakis.

The research is still in the experimental phase, and during an asthma attack or breathing issues, normal medical advice should be followed, she added.

PALEXIA SR (tapentadol HCI) has been listed on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme, and is the first muopioid receptor agonist (MOR) and noradrenaline reuptake inhibitor (NRI) analgesic in a single molecule to be PBS-listed.

Palexia SR is a centrally-acting schedule 8 analgesic which is TGA registered for the treatment of moderate to severe chronic pain unresponsive to non-narcotic analgesia, and has been listed as a restricted benefit for "chronic disabling pain."

Authority is required for increased maximum quantities and/or repeats.

Philips Salesforce pact

DUTCH electronics giant Philips has announced a strategic alliance with Salesforce.com to deliver an "open, cloud-based healthcare platform" focusing on patient relationship management.

The platform aims to allow caregivers to collaborate closely in support of their patients, and will enable medical device and data interoperability - the collection of data and subsequent analysis to enable clinical decision making.

It will also enable patients to take a more active role in managing their personal health, with the vision to create apps covering everything from self-care and prevention to diagnosis and treatment through recovery.

The first applications, Philips eCareCoordinator and Philips eCareCompanion, will allow health professionals to monitor patients with chronic conditions at home.

THE Australian Self-Medication Industry says it's disappointed that legislative reform of Permitted (coded) indications for Listed Medicines has stalled (PD Wed), after the Therapeutic Goods Administration confirmed it would not be progressing the required legislation at this stage.

The TGA had proposed removing the "free text" option for sponsors listing a medicine on the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods, which it said had resulted in a large number of inappropriate indications and other statements being entered on the ARTG.

Earlier this week the TGA published submissions to a consultation on the proposals, with the Office of Complementary Medicines (OCM) announcing that implementation would be delayed pending broader consideration of the implications of the deregulation agenda for the TGA.

ASMI Regulatory and Scientific Affairs Director, Steve Scarff, said the organisation and its members had put a substantial amount of work into the reform.

"We urge the TGA to press ahead," he said.

Scarff said the OCM had noted that part of the Permitted Indications reform can be implemented within the existing regulatory framework or increased

Action on indications urged

In particular, the updating of the indications list in the Electronic Listing Facility will be progressed, which will make it easier for sponsors to select indications which are both eligible for listing and compliant with advertising requirements.

Scarff said that ASMI was reviewing the draft Permitted Indications list, including for traditional medicine indications, and would work with members and the TGA "to ensure a comprehensive list is developed."

Benzoyl peroxide alert

THE US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is warning that the use of certain acne products containing the active ingredients benzoyl peroxide or salicylic acid can cause rare but serious and potentially lifethreatening allergic reactions or severe irritation.

An FDA spokesperson said there is currently no mention of the possibility of these very severe allergic reactions on the product labels, and "it's important that consumers know about them, and that they know what to do if they occur."

A number of skin treatments sold in Australia contain these actives.
