#### **ACT: ED 4 emergency**

**ACT** Health is encouraging people with non life-threatening injuries to see their pharmacist, GP or walkin centre, following a peak in ED presentations.

Director general Dr Peggy Brown said there had been 1,436 presentations to the Canberra Hospital ED last week, an average of 205 patients per day, with 11,395 in September already.

ACT Health said local pharmacists were qualified to give expert advice on many health issues.



# STIs on the rise

**RATES** for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) have seen increases, including the highest level ever recorded for syphilis, due to a decline in condom use.

The Kirby Institute released three reports yesterday, including its Annual Surveillance Report, which found gonorrhoea levels had increased "substantially", with 14,947 notifications in 2013 compared with 13,842 in 2012, with rate of diagnosis up 80% over the last five years.

However this could be due to increased testing, the Institute said.

Australia recorded its highest ever levels of syphilis in 2013, with 1,765 infections, particularly among gay men, the report found.

**UNSW Centre for Social Research** in Health director Professor John de Wit said there had been a gradual decline in condom use by gay men over the past 10 to 20 years, particularly among HIV positive men, who tended to safeguard by having sex with HIV positive partners, which did not protect from other STIs.

STI rates were disproportionately high in Indigenous communities, and Australia needed to continue to raise awareness of symptoms and

the need for regular testing and improved access to this, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Program head Dr Marlene Kong said.

The surveillance report also found that the estimated number of people dying from liver disease related to hepatitis C infection had more than doubled in the last 10 years, while 210,000 people were living with chronic hepatitis B and C virus infections in 2013.

# Soliris gets PBS listing

THE Department of Health has said it will fund the listing of Soliris (eculizumab) for the treatment of atypical haemolytic uraemic syndrome (aHUS) on the PBS at a cost of \$63m over four years.

The average cost of treatment was more than \$500,000 per patient per year, it said, and the listing follows on from Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee (PBAC) recommendations in March.

In an out of session meeting, the PBAC said there was no "convincing evidence" that demonstrated all patients should routinely have uninterrupted, life-long eculizumab therapy.

It re-iterated its previous advice that patients who achieved remission should discontinue treatment with eculizumab after a defined period.

"Further, the PBAC concluded that, in light of the evidence

currently available, the most appropriate duration for initial, continuous administration of eculizumab is 12 months.

"In reaching this conclusion the PBAC noted, among other matters, that the vast majority of the benefit observed in patients receiving eculizumab occurs in the first six months of treatment."

The Department of Health said it accepted the recommendations and was waiting for a response from sponsor, Alexion, to these.
