Cannabis for epilepsy

MEDICINAL cannabis may be a a promising treatment for children and young adults with treatment resistant epilepsy and it is generally well-tolerated in doses up to 25mg/ kg/day, according to a preliminary study presented to the annual meeting of the American Epilepsy Society this week.

The authors concluded that these initial results from an uncontrolled study should now be further tested in randomised controlled trials.

THE recent TGA decision to defer its verdict (PD 19 Nov) on the upscheduling of codeine-containing OTC medications conflicts with rising codeine analgesics misuse, its devastating consequences and the recognition that opioid misuse is a public health concern, according to ScriptWise ceo, Bee Mohamed.

While pharmacy lobby groups have applauded the move saying it enables the early implementation of a real-time monitoring solution, Mohamed says, "We already have very real statistics today which require immediate solutions".
