Default 20 day rule

THE Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee says in future its default position will be to apply the "Safety Net 20 Day Rule" to all new PBS listings.

Dosage variability, in and of itself, should not automatically exclude a drug from the rule, however the PBAC recommended that Palliative Care Schedule and Dental Schedule listings should still be exempted.

The PBAC has also asked the Health Department to develop a list of current PBS medicines to which the 20 day rule could be applied.

New AMA pharmacist plan

THE Australian Medical
Association this morning provided
a proposal to the government to
make "non-dispensing pharmacists"
a key part of the future general
practice health care team.

The Pharmacist in General Practice Incentive Program (PGPIP) suggested by the AMA would make general practices more efficient as well as providing better care for patients and new career opportunities for pharmacists.

"Under this program, pharmacists within general practice would assist with things such as medication management, providing patient education on their medications, and supporting GP prescribing with advice on medication interactions and newly available medications," said AMA president Brian Owler.

He said the PGPIP would create "significant Budget savings across the whole health system" by reducing fragmentation of care, improving prescribing and use of medicines and reducing hospital admissions from adverse drug events.

A Deloitte Access Economics analysis commissioned by the AMA estimated that if 3,100 practices took up the PGPIP it would cost about \$1 billion over four years.

However this would be more than offset through other savings such as reduced hospital admissions, PBS savings and lower Medicare costs because of reduced GP attendances following a moderate or severe adverse reaction.

"The AMA has developed this model in consultation with the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia, and it has the full backing of the PSA," Owler said.

Wholesalers say 6CPA "missed opportunity"

NATIONAL Pharmaceutical Services Association president Patrick Davies says the absence of a floor in the pharmacist's wholesale margin within the newly signed Sixth Community Pharmacy Agreement (see p2) is a "missed opportunity".

He said the peak wholesaler body had arguing consistently for this measure, which would have given pharmacy owners much greater protection from the impact of falling PBS prices.

However the increase in overall funding to pharmacy will assist in offsetting the inevitable impacts of PBS reform.

Davies welcomed the certainty afforded by the five year agreement and the continuation of the Community Service Obligation.

Flexibility within the new CSO arrangements under the 6CPA would also "promote supply chain flexibility," he added.

Ley's 'balanced' PBS reform

HEALTH Minister Sussan Ley says the PBS Access and Sustainability Package of reforms introduced into Parliament yesterday strikes the "right balance" between supporting the needs of consumers, industry and taxpayers.

As well as the Sixth Community Pharmacy Agreement, the govt has signed a strategic pact with the Generic Medicines Industry Association and an "in-principle" agreement with Medicines Australia, she said.

The package, which is today being widely reported in mainstream media as a major win for the Pharmacy Guild, will provide "total efficiencies of \$6.6 billion over five years across the entire pharmaceutical supply chain".

Key measures include changes to price disclosure arrangements for medicines in the F2 formulary.

Under this change generic medicine prices will be reduced by as much as 50% from Oct 2016 by removing the 'originator' brand version of the drug from pricing calculations, Ley said.

Pharmacists will be able to discount the PBS co-payment by up to \$1, and the 'premium-free dispensing initiative' will only apply when there is a premium charged for another brand of the same drug - a move which Ley said would better support the uptake of generics.

Patented medicines (those on the F1 forumlary) will also be subject to a 5% cut after five years on the PBS, and loopholes around combination drugs will be closed, saving more than \$600 million over five years.

There will also be \$20 million for an awareness campaign to support the increased use of 'biosimilar medicines' by patients, pharmacists and specialists.

Under the 6CPA there will be a doubling of investment in pharmacy-run primary care programs, of up to \$1.26 billion, and there's \$1.5 billion in funding for the new "set, transparent" handling and infrastructure fee for pharmacists which Ley said would "restore pharmacist remuneration to average levels provided under the Fifth Community Pharmacy Agreement".

And some low-cost OTC medicines will also be removed from the PBS.

The overall package includes the previously flagged independent review of pharmacy remuneration and location rules, which will be undertaken during the first two years of the 6CPA.

TWC purchases Chemplus



TERRY White Chemists is set for significant expansion into South Australia, with parent company TWC Group Investments Limited \$2.76 million purchase of Chem Plus Pty Ltd, the franchise management company which supports the SA-based Chemplus pharmacy network.

Comprising 60 pharmacies throughout metropolitan Adelaide and regional South Australia, Chemplus and TWC were said to share a "strongly aligned strategic position in terms of a focus on health and growth".

TWC chairman Terry White said the takeover would enable the merged group to fast-track opportunities in the marketplace.

"The combined group has a market share in excess of 8% and will provide increased business opportunities for all members, at a time when scale matters," he said.

Chemplus ceo Nick Tsamaidis will remain in a "leadership position" with the Chemplus business based in South Australia.

Champlus chairman Scott McGregor will join the TWC board, with the transaction anticipated to settle on 31 Jul this year.

McGregor said the combined business model "ensures the unique capabilities and qualities of the Chemplus group are maintained and developed in South Australia,

while providing access to the benefits of being part of a national network.

"The combined group will form the largest retail pharmacy network in South Australia with the capability to support the growth aspiration of the overall business across the nation," he said.

"The tightening in the market demands large scale retail pharmacy capability, and we needed to consider how we would approach that in order to best support the team at Chemplus as well as our member pharmacies into the future.

"Terry White Chemists has demonstrated significant retail capability...it is outperforming the market when it comes to sales and offers an impressive private label stable...and leads the way in terms of professional services," he added.

MEANWHILE in a separate arrangement, the existing Chemplus distribution centre will be transferred to the Symbion facility at Underdale.

This will enable daily deliveries of over-the-counter stock to the Chemplus network, McGregor said.

Symbion's Brett Barons said the wholesaler had a long association with Chemplus, and was "pleased we can play an important role in improving services to the pharmacies".







Five year generic pact

A FIRST-TIME Strategic Agreement between the government and the Generic **Medicines Industry Association** will give a "five year period of certainty" to the sector, according to GMiA chairman Mark Crotty.

Part of the government's **PBS Access and Sustainability** Package (see p1), the agreement "recognises the significant savings that continue to be delivered by generic medicines and biosimilars, first by providing competition and then through price disclosure".

Crotty said the pact is the result of "constructive and respectful dialogue" between the GMiA and the government over the last three months.

Under the agreement, no further price-related changes will be made to the F2 formulary.

It also states that the Department of Health and GMiA will "work collaboratively to identify, and resolve quickly, any unintended consequences of budget savings particularly where they may impact on the reliable supply of vital, affordable medicines".

PSA welcomes 6CPA

THE Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) has welcomed the signing of the Sixth Community Pharmacy Agreement (6CPA) between the Australian Government and the Pharmacy Guild of Australia (PD 27 May).

PSA national president Grant Kardachi, said the agreement would bring a measure of certainty to the community pharmacy sector.

"PSA particularly welcomes the doubling in this agreement to \$1.26 billion of funding for the provision of patient-focussed professional services," Kardachi said.

"This \$1.26 billion for pharmacistdelivered professional services is what the PSA has been long advocating for and represents the largest funding for this crucial area of health provision of any agreement to date."

Kardachi added that the strengthening of this funding element is an important recognition of the role that pharmacists can play in health delivery beyond the core role of dispensing.

"This agreement reiterates there is a common interest in promoting the sustainability, efficiency and cost-effectiveness of the PBS, as well as the viability of an effective community pharmacy sector."

"Got kidney? I need 1?" reads the message on Neal Raisman's back window (below), with the same posted on his daughter's video who lives not far from him in Columbus, Ohio.

They took the unusual approach after his relatives were ruled out as donors because of diabetes and other medical reasons, reports the Columbus Dispatch.



QUEENSLAND police have cracked a major case, arresting a man who has been charged with stealing cattle gallstones.

The Toowoomba Stock and Rural Crime Investigation Squad (SARCIS) raided a property last week and found the stones which were allegedly pinched from a nearby abbatoir over a period of several months.

Popular for use in traditional Oriental medicine, the gallstones are believed to be able to treat liver illnesses such as hepatitis, with the haul understood to be of "considerable value".

According to a SARCIS blog post a 38-year-old man has been issued with a notice to appear in the Toowoomba Magistrates Court next month, with quality stones worth as much as \$20,000 per kilogram.
