### **New AusPARs**

THE TGA has added two Australian Public Assessment Reports (AusPARs): follitropin alfa (rch) (Bemfola, Afolia from Finox Biotech Australia) for hormone management in specific patients and eltrombopag (Revolade by Novartis) for certain patients with aplastic anaemia.

MEANWHILE the TGA's Advisory **Committee on Prescription** Medicines has summarised the therapeutic goods referred for advice revealing a list of 15 products of which seven are new chemical entities, including an inactivated influenza virus vaccine (surface antigens).

Six products: anakinra, etanercept, regorafenib, rifaximin, apixaban and adalimumab had extensions to their indications, while rituximab recorded a major variation relating to its dosing.

# **Qld ticks pharmacy vaccination**

**THE** Queensland Government has approved legislation to enable pharmacists to administer vaccinations to the public in a community pharmacy setting. PSA Qld Branch president Bruce Elliot welcomed the decision, saying the amended legislation will enable accessible pharmacist-delivered vaccinations to provide healthcare benefits to local communities.

"This legislation will allow trained pharmacists to vaccinate for influenza, measles and pertussis, providing positive health outcomes for the community," Elliot said.

"Community pharmacy provides a convenient and easily-accessible location for consumers to access vital health care services, such as immunisations.

"Additionally, this legislation will ensure there is a trained cohort of pharmacists who could also be authorised to quickly deliver vaccinations to the community during times of emergency or pandemics."

The Ethical and Clinical Guidelines are the culmination of a collaborative effort by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC), the Organ and Tissue Authority and TSANZ.

"Through the joint efforts of the Queensland Branches of the Pharmacy Guild of Australia and PSA as well as Queensland Health we have pioneered the regulation of pharmacists delivering immunisations in pharmacies which is now seen in every State and Territory in Australia, apart from Victoria," Logan said.

**Qld Pharmacist Immunisation** Pilot (QPIP) research lead, **QUT School of Clinical Sciences** Professor Lisa Nissen, said that the new legislation follows the QPIP program where over 35,000 adults were immunised by pharmacists as part of a two year trial.

To administer vaccinations in Qld the vaccinating pharmacist and the pharmacy premises must be compliant with the requirements of the Health (Drugs and Poisons) Regulation 1996, Drug Therapy Protocol - Pharmacist Vaccination Program and the Pharmacist Vaccination Standard.

### Fake sildenafil alert

**THE** Therapeutic Goods Administration has issued a safety alert on two sildenafil imports unapproved in Australia.

Sold under the names U.S. Black Gold tablets and MMC Zang Ba Bao tablets, the TGA believes some consumers may have bought them online, and for their own safety are advised to return them to their local pharmacy for disposal. More info at www.tga.gov.au.

## Pharmacist guilty

**A NEW** York pharmacist has admitted to criminal diversion of prescription medications and taking bribes in a case involving a US-wide scheme to divert HIV drugs.

55-year-old Glenn Schabel also pleaded guilty to money laundering, with the convictions part of an "Operation Black-Market Meds" investigation undertaken by state Attorney-General.

The case stemmed from the 2012 discovery that Schabel and others were using fake prescription drug wholesalers in several states.

They used the networks to launder money and sell more than US\$274 million in diverted medications from illegal or unknown sources - including some that had been previously dispensed and then resold on the black market.

# **Compounder prosecuted**

**THE** NSW Health Care Complaints Commission has made findings of unsatisfactory professional conduct and professional misconduct against Nicholas Bova, the proprietor and pharmacist-incharge of Caringbah-based Bova Compounding Chemist.

The prosecution related to a product dispensed to an ophthalmic surgeon for a corneal cross-linking procedure in late 2011 and a range of breaches of the Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation.

In particular the Tribunal found Bova failed to take reasonable steps to clarify whether Dextran T(500) sulfate was appropriate and safe for use in the human eye, as well as dispensing ten bottles for a single patient when he should have been aware that this was an excessive quantity.

The Tribunal also found Bova's pharmacy had failed to comply with a large number of regulatory requirements, including failure to ensure scripts for special restricted substances were stored separately, failure to keep a drug register for drugs of addiction, supplying oxytocin to male clients, failure to store S8 drugs in a safe and failure to maintain a drug register for dexamphetamine, codeine and ketamine.

During the period since 2011 the Tribunal said Bova had "put himself in a position where he would be unlikely to repeat any of the breaches" but said given the multiplicity of them he was guilty of professional misconduct.

The Tribunal said it would consider the issue of protective orders on a further hearing date to be set down.

New regulations set to take effect in Shanghai 01 May this year will require offspring to "visit and send greetings often" or face the prospect of losing some of their credit rating.
