Pregnancy CM study

A NEW research project from Queensland's Griffith University aims to dispel myths around vitamin use for women before, during and after pregnancy.

The study, conducted by PhD candidate Janelle McAlpine, will survey several thousand women on what multivitamins they take, as well as their general health, diet and the influences on their choices of food and supplements.

"For women who give birth questions will also be asked on issues such as the birth weight of their baby and whether they laboured spontaneously.

"These are the sorts of things that we believe could be influenced by supplement usage but have never actually been thoroughly researched before," McAlpine said.

S8 Xanax has reduced AEs

RESTRICTING access to Xanax (alprazolam) by rescheduling it to S8 has had a significant impact on overall use of the medication in Australia, as well as resulting in fewer adverse events.

The TGA shifted alprazolam from Schedule 4 to Schedule 8 (PD 22 Jan 2014), with the move also prompting Pfizer to cease marketing the branded version of Xanax in Australia because it was no longer commercially viable. Researchers from the University of NSW have found prescriptions for the medication declined 22% in the year since the rescheduling, with the results of their study

published in the JAMA Internal Medicine journal this week.

Dispensing of alprazolam fell 24%, and the study also found the rescheduling had cut the number of alprazolam related calls to the Poisons Information Centre by 50%.

The authors recommended further research on how the rescheduling has affected private alprazolam prescriptions, which are not captured by PBS data.

UK relocation blocked

AUTHORITIES in Britain have disallowed the relocation of a pharmacy in the city of Derby because of the potential impact on women seeking emergency contraception.

The request from Community Pharmacies (UK) Limited to move the Superdrug branch about 600m from a shopping centre to a GP surgery was denied by the National Health Service.

The pharmacy group took the matter to the UK High Court, but the judge ruled in favour of the NHS which said many of Superdrug's customers were young women accustomed to getting the morning after pill from the pharmacy.

Sigma diabetes referrals

AMCAL and Guardian pharmacies have referred as many as 100 patients to their GP after they underwent in-pharmacy HbA1c testing under a program launched by Sigma Pharmaceuticals in Mar.

The screening, which is now available in 32 Amcal and Guardian Pharmacies across Australia, builds on the brands' broad selection of point-of-care tests offered to patients.

Sigma has highlighted the diagnostic option as part of Diabetes Awareness Week (10-16 Jul), with an education campaign urging Australians to better understand diabetes.

Findings from an Amcal Consumer Health Barometer survey showed almost 40% of those with a family history of serious illness refuse to get tested - despite one person being diagnosed with diabetes across Australia every 5 minutes.

The research also revealed about half of the population had not heard of gestational diabetes, while one in ten respondents assumed you must be overweight to develop diabetes.
