Prepare for live review webcast

THE live online webcast which will wrap up the public consultation sessions for the Review of Pharmacy Remuneration and Regulation will take place next week, with the online link to the webinar site now live.

The event takes place at 7pm AEST on Wed 07 Sep from Canberra's Marcus Clarke theatre, and will be hosted by journalist Ellen Fanning with presenters including review panel members, industrial economist Professor Stephen King, pharmacist member Bill Scott and consumer representative Jo Watson.

A test page allows prospective online participants to check whether they can receive the live stream, with online viewers able to contribute to the conversation by submitting questions and comments for the panellists via the hashtag #pharmacyreview or via the site's Livechat facility.

ACT pharmacies quit help

THE ACT Branch of the Pharmacy Guild of Australia will oversee an innovative program to help pregnant women quit smoking, in partnership with community pharmacies in Canberra.

The branch has been awarded two years of funding for the project under the ACT Government's Health Promotion Grants program.

The 'Quit for 2 through Community Pharmacy' program will urge the target audience of pregnant women who smoke, and women who continue to smoke after recently giving birth, to seek face-to-face quit advice and counselling in community pharmacies across the Territory.

Other groups will also collaborate in the scheme, with various ACT organisations providing women's health services assisting in disseminating the message.

The proposed outcomes include awareness of the benefits to mother and baby in quitting, accessibility of the service across the ACT and increased uptake by pregnant women who smoke.

The program follows on the 2014-16 ACT Community Pharmacy Smoking Cessation Counselling program which was also funded by the ACT government.

ACT Guild branch president, Amanda Galbraith, thanked the government, for "continuing to support the vital work that community pharmacies do in the field of smoking cessation.

"The accessibility of community pharmacies to all patients makes them the right place to try to improve the numbers of people who successfully quit smoking, and pharmacies are delighted to be playing a role," Galbraith added.

A to Z of Skin online

THE Australasian College of Dermatologists (ACD) has announced the launch of the *A* to *Z* of *Skin*, the country's first comprehensive online directory of skin conditions, created and peer-reviewed by more than 100 Australian dermatologists.

The free resource aims to help anyone searching for reliable information on skin conditions and associated symptoms.

A to Z of Skin is a "trusted source of accurate information and images regarding more than 200 conditions, from common skin complaints, such as acne, psoriasis and skin cancer, to less frequent conditions, including vitiligo and lichen planus," the College said.

"Pharmacists and pharmaceutical scientists must take responsibility for mitigating the environmental consequences of medicines," the statement reads, with the policy encompassing the entire course of medicines use from manufacture and distribution through to prescribing and dispensing.

Blackmores expands SEA

BLACKMORES is set to spread its reach into Indonesia, with the launch of a new joint venture with Kalbe Farma, one of the largest health care companies in South East Asia.

CEO Christine Holgate announced the pact about twelve months ago, and has now confirmed the rollout of Blackmores products across Kalbe's extensive distribution network in Indonesia.

She said the launch would initially involve eight products, with 25 in market by the end of the year, according to the Australian.

"It is quite a complex registration process in Indonesia compared with Australia," she added.

"But we are used to the different Asian markets where it can take six months to a year to get registered."

Holgate said Blackmores chose Kalbe as business partner because it was a major supplier of nutritional supplements in

"It's a market worth around \$2 billion in Indonesia and it's growing really fast," she said.

"The country has one of the fastest growing middle classes in the world and it's predicted to be the third biggest economy in the

world by 2030."

Kalbe's training processes and its strong representation in shopping centres throughout Indonesia add significant weight to the partnership with Indonesians increasingly interested in more Western versions of natural health products.

Holgate said only 2% of Australia's international trade was done with Indonesia and added there were business opportunities in areas such as health, education and financial services.

THE Therapeutic Goods Administration has advised of further shortages of metformin extended release tablets (PD 11 Aug), with limited availability of items from Alphapharm, Apotex and Arrow Pharma under the Diabex, Diaformin, Chemmart, APO-Metofrmin, Metex and Terry White Chemists brands.

Pharmacists and wholesalers are requested to order minimum quantities of stock from suppliers to try and minimise the chance of further shortages as supplies become available - tga.gov.au.
