# **NSW** compounding probe

THE Pharmacy Council of NSW is seeking expressions of interest to undertake a Commissioned Research Project into pharmacy compounding of medicines.

The move follows an increasing number of notifications that involve compounding within community pharmacies.

"The Council wishes to increase its understanding of the extent of current compounding practice in NSW, and to assist it in this aim, is seeking expressions of interest from persons willing to undertake research in this area," according to a statement issued yesterday.

The commissioned project seeks to investigate compounding services performed and provided by Australian community pharmacies.

The Council is seeking a detailed analysis that explores the scope of current compounding services, incentives, compliance with legislation and practice standards, and a comparison of the services provided and trends between

various states and territories.

A comparison of models of compounding services offered in Australia and overseas is also sought, as well as a review of training available for compounding.

Applications to undertake the research must be submitted by 28 Feb, with the Council envisaging the contract will commence on 03 Apr and be completed by 30 Nov.

The project grant is worth a maximum of \$10,000 - for more information see hpca.nsw.gov.au.

#### NZ cannabis loosened

MINISTERIAL approval will no longer be required for New Zealand patients requiring medicinal cannabis with more authority in the hands of specialists.

The New Zealand Ministry of Health already had the power to sign-off on a specialist's application to prescribe pharmaceutical-grade drug Sativex, and more relaxations are planned.

#### **Insulin injection CPD**

THE Australian College of Pharmacy has announced the release of its latest Continuing Professional Development (CPD) e-learning module on 'Improving the injection experience for patients using insulin'.

Covering pharmacist competencies 2.3, 4.2, 4.3, 6.1, 6.2, 6.3 and 7.2, the College said this module was designed to build on pharmacists' existing knowledge of insulin therapy for diabetes and help them advise patients on the optimal insulin injection technique.

Learning objectives include an understanding of the different modes of action of available insulins, varying regimens of therapy, how to commence treatment for both type 1 and 2 diabetes patients, common adverse events, difference in needles and their supportive data and more.

Congratulations to yesterday's winner, Natalie Bubica from API. Party to achieve a specific policy outcome on the PBS co-payment measures proposed in the 2014 Budget.

The ABC report incorrectly inferred a donation by the Guild to the ALP had been linked to the scrapping of the proposal, said Guild exec director David Quilty.

"The ABC story mistakenly mixes up the 2014 Budget co-payment increases with an entirely separate Government measure in May 2015 and then uses this inaccuracy to draw a baseless inference about the Guild's political behaviour."

Quilty said the Guild had called on ABC News to "immediately acknowledge this error, correct the story and retract its baseless inference".

#### **UK** counterfeits

**TWO** British men have been sentenced after pleading guilty to supplying unlicensed, and potentially dangerous medicinal products following an extensive investigation by the UK Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA).

The pair were charged with offences under Trade Mark, Misuse of Drugs and medicines regulatory legislation after the MHRA received information that suspected illegal medicines were being delivered to their home addresses.

Enforcement officers conducted a raid and found almost 470,000 tablets of unlicensed erectile dysfunction medication, counterfeit medicines and the controlled drug Tramadol, along with records of medicines trading and client details.

MALE circumcision has been demonstrated to confer as much benefit as vaccination, according to a systematic review published in the World Journal of Clinical Pediatrics.

The benefits of the procedure were found to exceed the associated risks by 200 to one, authors said.

Researchers at the University Sydney, the University of New South Wales and several teaching hospitals report that uncircumcised males face an 80% risk of developing a foreskinrelated condition requiring medical attention.

**GERMANY'S** Federal Institute for Drugs and Medical Devices is creating an agency to oversee the cultivation of marijuana and the subsequent production of cannabis to be used medicinally, in line with a new law approved by the Bundestag, Germany's lower house of parliament, according to the British Medical Journal.

### **TGA testing coming**

**THE** Therapeutic Goods Administration has confirmed that from mid-2017 it will begin publishing the outcomes of laboratory testing on its website.

The TGA tests about 2,000 samples annually, with the release of the results part of its response to the Expert Review of Medicines and Medical Devices Regulation.
