The winning photo will be drawn on the 22 Sep 2017 and receive a morning tea, delivered to your pharmacy on World Pharmacist Day to get the party started, courtesy of the Guild's Tasmania branch. **SERIOUS** misuse of OTC painkillers containing codeine is costing one South Australian hospital around \$1 million per year, according to a University of South Australia five-year review of hospital admissions relating to their impact.

Lead investigator Dr Jacinta Johnson said "serious misuse" of codeine-combination products such as Nurofen Plus, Panadeine Extra and Mersyndol had led to increasing numbers of people being admitted to hospital with stomach ulcers and gastric bleeding, and acute kidney and liver failure.

Johnson, a lecturer in UniSA's School of Pharmacy and Medical Sciences, led the Australian-first study analysing the costs of 99 hospital admissions related to overthe-counter combination painkillers containing codeine (CACC) from 2010-2015 at a South Australian Hospital.

Thirty patients – many with multiple readmissions – cost taxpayers an average of \$10,000

Almost 70% were admitted with health issues relating to taking excessive amounts of ibuprofencodeine products, while 20% reported using paracetamolcodeine products and almost 9.4% used both.

In some cases patients were taking up to 90 tablets a day – the average was 28 which is almost five times the recommended daily dose.

People used the codeinecombined painkillers mainly for back pain, migraine and headaches.

The study was undertaken in the wake of a decision by the Federal Government's health regulatory body to ban OTC access to CACC products from Australian pharmacies from 01 Feb 2018.

Johnson added a balancing thought saying, "It is possible that doctor visits will spike, adding costs to Medicare.

"That remains to be seen and will no doubt be analysed in due course."

### TGA clamps down on unapproved goods

**THE** Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) has announced it has successfully pursued the conviction of a man and a woman in connection with two criminal charges surrounding the manufacture and supply of unapproved therapeutic goods.

The hearing was held on 12 Jul this year at Devonport, Tasmania.

The product, known as Black Salve, is not approved for marketing in Australia and has been the subject of TGA alerts referring to Black and Red salves in treating cancer and Black Salve, Red Salve and cansema

The two individuals were convicted and fined \$750 each and the court ordered the goods seized as evidential material and forfeited to the Commonwealth.

# Medlab 20 year patent

AUSTRALIAN-LISTED medical life science company Medlab Clinical Limited has been granted a 20-year patent covering the Australian market for its probiotic product, NRGBiotic.

The company announcement said that applications for patents were also underway in the United States, Europe and two Asian countries.

According to Medlab ceo Sean Hall, achieving a patent for NRGBiotic independently validates an important pillar of Medlab's science.

"To be granted a patent on our NRGBiotic product, Medlab needed to show uniqueness, usefulness and effectiveness," Hall said.

The product targets co-therapy in managing chronic diseases such as depression.

Along with probiotics and gut health, Medlab is also focused on Nanocelle delivery techology which is already being applied to a statin, and to forms of cannabis in trials.

NanaBis (tetrahydrocannabinol/ cannabidiol - THC/CBD) is under cannabis trial for advanced oncology patients with intractable pain while NanaBidial (CBD only) cannabis is in trials for patients with nausea, vomiting and seizures.

Medlab says it has five core research programs examining the role of bacteria in health: obesity. chronic kidney disease, depression, musculoskeletal muscle loss associated with ageing, and nonopioid pain management.
