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patients by improving access to pharmaceutical treatments and programs with the support of their doctor and pharmacist.

Prior to ordering NanaBis for patients, pharmacies will need an account with Medlab, with Sinapse urging that this be set up as soon as possible to ensure the pharmacy is ready for the first request.

Account opening procedures require the pharmacy to demonstrate its qualification for storing and handling Schedule 8 controlled drugs, in the form of a Pharmacy Registration Certificate or an Agreement with Medicare and the matching owner pharmacist's AHPRA registration certificate.

In addition to facilitating supply of NanaBis, a structured pharmacy support program is an integral part of the MCMP, which provides a streamlined process for medicinal cannabis prescribing and dispensing.

Sinapse noted there were also additional pharmacy and prescriber resources available via the MCMP website, including a CMI document and a NanaBis pricing table.

## Qld Guild vax supply

THE Queensland branch of the Pharmacy Guild has received Preferred Supplier status with the Qld Government for its members to provide flu vaccinations to government employees during the 2018 flu season.

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# **SHPA urges recognition**

THE Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia says there is no question that the scope of work of pharmacists is expanding contradicting the position held by the Pharmacy Guild which opposes pay rises for pharmacists under a "work value claim" sought by union group APESMA (PD 24 Apr).

Responding to last week's **Pharmacy Daily** report, SHPA ceo Kristin Michaels said evidence of the growing impact and influence of pharmacists continued to build across the sector.

# Dispensary Corner

**STOMACH** upsets, respiratory problems or just about anything medical - no problems, six billion cockroaches will fix anything, or so a Chinese company believes.

Chengdu-based Gooddoctor Pharmaceutical Group is breeding these little miracles in a multistorey building the size of two sports fields, according to the *South China Morning Post*.

Inside the artificial intelligence (AI)-controlled breeding site, the environment is described as "warm, humid, and dark" all year round, with every detail of food and moisture monitored by AI, which learns from historical data to determine the best conditions for peak roach reproduction.

The billions of roaches are crushed to create a healing potion sold to more than 4,000 hospitals across China and being used by some 40 million patients, the report says - like snake oil, most likely not crawling with evidence.

A UNIVERSITY in China has come up with a unique way to encourage more physical activity from its students.

The uni's upcoming annual sports day will feature a new "500 gram grenade toss" event, which has been introduced after a noted reluctance to participate in traditional athletic activities such as javelin and discus.

When replaced with grenade tossing, "students rushed to sign up," officials said.

Participants will be throwing weighted replicas of a Type 23 stick grenade, which was originally used by the German military in World War 2 and later adopted by the Chinese army.

# **Blackmores ramps capacity**



**BLACKMORES** has announced a strategic acquisition of 100% of the Catalent Australia tablet and soft-gel capsule manufacturing facility in Braeside, Vic, for \$43.2 million (*PD* breaking news Tue), expanding the company's ability to respond to changing market conditions.

The 30,000 square metre site is licensed to produce medicines by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) as well as by international regulators.

"Our strategy will be to continue to source a significant proportion of our products from our existing contract manufacturing partners and we will supplement this with our own manufacturing capacity through the Braeside facility," Blackmores chief executive officer Richard Henfrey explained.

In an ASX announcement, Blackmores also reported net sales for the nine months to 31 Mar of \$434 million, up 8.5% compared to the prior corresponding period, with net profit after tax at \$52 million, up 19.3% on the prior period.

Additionally, the announcement included the appointment to the Board as Non-Executive Director, of Jackie McArthur, 2016 Telstra NSW Businesswoman of the Year, with "extensive operational expertise across the Asia Pacific Region".

Commenting on the reported results, Henfrey said, "We made solid market share gains in Australia over the last quarter and remain the clear number one brand in Australia in both total market and domestic sales."

He added that recent structural changes in the sector had affected supply continuity of many smaller lines as well as export sales in the second and third quarters.

"The Board expects our current growth trajectory will continue and that we will deliver good profit growth for the full year," Henfrey concluded.

#### **MHRA plots Brexit**

**BRITAIN'S** Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) has released a new five-year corporate plan which includes an outline of how it plans to deal with the uncertainty around the UK's exit from the EU.

MHRA says it plans to boost its use of real-world data to support regulatory decision making, with the 2018-2023 plan also highlighting ongoing technological and scientific challenges, including genomics and increased personalisation of products.

New areas of regulation are likely to include digital/AI-based products as well as novel supply chains.

Despite the looming impact of Brexit, MHRA notes that pharmaceuticals is a key sector where, in the interests of public health, an "ongoing active regulatory partnership with Europe" makes sense.



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
