Ice-addicted trial

CALLED the N-ICE Trial, Australian researchers are investigating if N-Acetyl Cysteine, or NAC, can reduce cravings for ice (crystal methamphetamine) and help people stop using the substance, the Curtin University National Drug Research Institute (NDRI) has announced.

The N-ICE Trial is being conducted at frontline clinical services in Wollongong, Geelong and Melbourne.

Lead researcher and NDRI Associate Professor Rebecca McKetin said previous studies showed NAC could reduce cravings for methamphetamine use and other substances including cocaine, cannabis and tobacco.

Melanoma blood test

SCIENTISTS from Edith Cowan University (ECU) have developed a blood test capable of detecting melanoma in its early stages, an innovation which may save thousands of lives, and the health system millions of dollars.

Early detection can improve survival rates to 95% - the next step is a clinical trial to validate the findings, authors said - **CLICK HERE**.

NSW roads minister Melinda Pavey has confirmed the launch of an awareness campaign for pharmacists, GPs and consumers about the risks of driving while on prescription medication.

She announced the move along with other road safety measures which will also mean patients treated with methadone will have to pass a "fitness-to-drive" assessment when they start treatment or if their dose changes. Pavey said the definition of "drug" in the state's Road Transport Act

Flu supplies shipped

SEQIRUS has announced the manufacture of an additional 500,000 doses of adult influenza vaccine, Afluria Quad (inactivated quadrivalent influenza vaccine, split virion) for the National Immunisation Program (NIP) ahead of schedule, with the first of the vaccines to be released this week.

Seqirus was asked to go back into production by the government due to an increase in demand for vaccine on the back of a severe influenza season last year.

In addition, Seqirus also made the decision to manufacture 200,000 extra doses for the private market.


Commercial Operations vice president Dr Lorna Meldrum said, "Our team has been working around the clock, seven days a week to produce an additional 700,000 doses for Australia".

Supply from the Parkville, Victoria site will continue to be released over the coming weeks, she added.

under the influence of a drug can mean illicit or prescribed - but this gives us capacity to name new drugs coming in," she said.

"Any mind or brain altering substance, whether it be alcohol, illicit drugs, or pharmaceutical drugs - they can all have an impact on your ability to drive safely."

NSW chief health officer, Dr Kerry Chant, said health professionals must educate patients on the risk of driving while taking medication.

"We want to strengthen the information provided to patients on the risks of prescription medication and how that might interact with things, particularly alcohol."

Chant also stressed that patients who were stable on opioid treatments such as methadone were safe drivers.

Emerge funding

CHRONIC fatigue syndrome (CFS) organisation Emerge Australia has received \$370,000 in government funding to support its work in providing support, information and advocacy for people with myalgic encephalomyelitis and CFS.

Programs funded include an information line, a survey and an international research symposium to be held in Australia.

733 SHPA abstracts!

THE Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia (SHPA) has received a record total of 733 abstracts submitted for its upcoming Medicines Management 2018 conference, after a late surge in submissions last week.

That was more than 15% higher than the previous record set in 2015, with SHPA said it shows "an unprecedented level of enthusiasm from Australian hospital pharmacists and technicians to showcase their innovation".

MM2018 takes place this Nov in Brisbane, with a three-day program of presentations and posters along with several lead-in workshops.

"Delegates have a unique opportunity to gain a professional edge in advanced leadership or in research, or to accelerate specialty development," she said.

PEOPLE are just dying to get into the cemetery in the peaceful German hamlet of Berchtesgaden - so much so that officials are holding a lottery for vacant plots.

The town in the Bavarian Alps has for many years been turning down applicants seeking to rest in peace in the 17th-century graveyard due to a lack of space, reports the BBC.

However they have now created 200 new plots, and will conduct a random draw today to give everyone an equal chance.

The report says so far about 280 people have applied for one of the coveted final resting places.



THEY gave it a good try, but it was always going to be a long shot.

An attempt by the so-called First Church of Cannabis in Indiana, USA to get the state to recognise a religious exemption to marijuana laws has gone up in smoke.

Last week a judge ruled that members of the church could not smoke marijuana as a religious sacrament, in the culmination of a case that has been running for more than three years.

The ruling said making an exemption would make it difficult to enforce drug laws, because "officers are not trained or equipped to determine the sincerity of an individual's religious beliefs".

The church's founder said he would appeal to a higher court.
