Pharmacy meningococcal vax

TASMANIAN Health Minister Michael Ferguson yesterday announced the extension of the state's free vaccination program against meningococcal disease, with pharmacists among the health professionals who will administer the immunisations.

Ferguson said the program would cover people aged between six weeks and 20 years, with the move following five recently confirmed cases of the disease in the Hobart area, including one death.

All Tasmanians born after 01 Aug 1997 are eligible, with this cohort having been identified as the group at greatest risk of contracting and spreading the disease.

Pharmacists will be permitted to administer the meningococcal vaccine to children aged ten and over, with the jabs to cover strains A, C, W and Y.

Pharmacy stakeholders have hailed the move, which sees pharmacists' scope of practice extended from the previous Tas restriction to only administer flu vaccines and brings the state more in line with some other jurisdictions.

Pharmacy Guild Tasmanian Branch President, Madeleine Bowerman, said the meningococcal expansion was "a safe, and sensible use of the medicine expertise and high accessibility of community pharmacies across the state."

PSA National President Shane Jackson said "this is a welcome response by the Tasmanian Government to a major public health need.

"This is another step forward in reducing the impact of vaccinepreventable disease in Australia."

Opdivo indication

BRISTOL-MYERS Squibb today announced that patients with recurrent or metastatic squamous cell carcinoma of the head and neck will have access to Opdivo (nivolumab) via the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) from 01 Aug.

The monotherapy authority required streamlined PBS listing represents the first time patients with recurrent or metastatic head and neck cancer will have PBS reimbursed access to an immunooncology therapy.

This will provide healthcare professionals and patients with a new and affordable treatment option for this hard-to-treat cancer that often requires a multifaceted approach of surgery, radiotherapy, chemotherapy and supportive care, BMS said.

BioCeuticals® Penalty rate anger

UNION group Professional Pharmacists Australia has called for a reversal of last year's cuts to penalty rates, highlighting the outcome of a Victorian Parliamentary Inquiry released this week which found that 12 months after the controversial changes there has been no evidence of an increase in pharmacy opening hours nor in employment opportunities for pharmacists.

No rose for iNova Pharmaceuticals

INOVA Pharmaceuticals has severed ties with Channel Ten's The Bachelor after a mix-up in a media release implied the blockbuster reality show was being sponsored by the company's prescription-only Duromine product (PD Wed).

iNova had been planning to run branded content advertisements during the show around its "Can Science Take The Weight Off" campaign, but says it didn't intend to tie the messages to Duromine.

"Our disease state awareness campaign focussed on promoting a healthy lifestyle and the responsible role that medicallymanaged weight loss can play," an iNova spokesperson told online

marketing website Mumbrella.

Unfortunately Channel Ten's press statement announcing the sponsors of the show included a direct reference to the medication, rather than to iNova as a sponsor.

The TV network has now retracted its previous statement, but iNova has cancelled any involvement with the program in order to "avoid any misunderstanding".

Other pharmacy-related sponsors include Aspen S-26 and Blistex, with a Channel Ten spokesman stressing the "family-friendly and brand-safe credentials" of the show.

The sixth season of the show features Australian rugby player Nick "Honey Badger" Cummins.

Dispensary Corner

HOW hard would it be to recruit marijuana smokers for a study that provides free hits?

Not so hard apparently - the California legislature is funding a UC San Diego study to determine how cannabis affects driving performance.

Around 180 people will smoke varying amounts of marijuana or placebo and then participate in a series of driving simulations and cognitive tests.

"We are not only looking at how impaired a driver is at different levels of smoking, but also how long that impairment lasts," says Tom Marcotte, co-director of the UCSD's Center for Medicinal Cannabis Research, which is conducting the study.

The research will inform clearer guidelines for police officers.



ALSO in the USA, there's an environmental crisis in the state of Arizona where a number of poisonous toads have been stolen from a conservation area.

The Sonoran desert toads are a

protected species, but have been abducted in their droves recently. Video of the toad thieves has been turned over to local law enforcement authorities, seeking charges of violating the area's posted hours and vandalism.

The miscreants are believed to be planning to lick the amphibians which are understood to have hallucinogenic effects.

Unsafe meds use

MORE than half of Australians consuming prescription medications could be following practices against their doctor's instructions, according to new findings from the Australian Patients Association.

The consumer perception survey of Australian Patients Association members found even those who considered themselves to be proficient at managing their medicines still engaged in unsafe practices.

The poll of 155 consumers found 78% of respondents were taking two or more medications, with the most common reasons being to manage chronic disease (42%) or to control pain (18%).

Half of those surveyed admitted to not completing their prescription as directed, while 38% failed to check expiry dates.

Some 85% said they were easily able to source reliable information on taking their medication and 81% had recently completed a review of their medicines with a general practitioner or pharmacist in the last six months.
