Rural scholarships

THE Pharmacy Guild of Australia has announced the recipients of the **Rural Pharmacy** Scholarship Scheme 2018.



Thirty seven students from across the country have been awarded the prestigious scholarship.

The Rural Pharmacy Scholarships provide financial support to rural and remote students to help them undertake studies in pharmacy.

Scholarship holders receive \$10,000 each year, for up to four years of university study, to help cover the costs associated with study away from home.

They also participate in a mentor program aimed at reinforcing the students' ties to rural and regional Australia.

The Rural Pharmacy Scholarship Scheme is an initiative of the Rural Support Programs and is funded by the Department of Health as part of the 6CPA - CLICK HERE for the list.

Medicinal cannabis facility

LISTED medicinal cannabis company Cann Group has announced it has signed a heads of agreement with Australia Pacific Airports Melbourne



(APAM), securing the site of Cann's proposed Stage 3 medicinal cannabis cultivation and GMP manufacturing facility.

Under the lease arrangement, it is proposed that APAM will fund and undertake the primary build of the 37,000m2 facility, representing a multi-million dollar contribution to the project.

The facility construction is being designed by Aurora Larssen Projects (ALPS), a specialist greenhouse engineering consultancy providing technical consulting to the greenhouse industry worldwide.

The company says this is to be "Australia's largest state-of-the-art medicinal cannabis operation".

Cann, with the support of ALPS, will complete the fit-out and technology deployment, an estimated investment by Cann of approximately \$100 million, and will employ 170 staff.

The company successfully completed a capital raising late

last year and will use a combination of debt and equity to fund the new expansion project. Cann Group ceo Peter Crock

(pictured) said

the support of APAM put Cann in a strong position as it embarked upon its Stage 3 expansion.

'This site is ideally suited to our needs and the heads of agreement represents an important step that allows us to proceed with final design," Crock said.

"APAM's contribution to the construction of these facilities will enable Cann to invest additional capital in increased cultivation capacity; expanded development and production capabilities, while also allowing for further future expansion."

THC appointment

Rare cancer research

THE Federal Government will provide \$33 million to Australian researchers to continue the fight against rare cancers and rare diseases, giving hope to thousands of patients.

Although there have been increased survival rates for some cancers such as breast and bowel cancer, survival rates for rare cancers such as brain and ovarian cancer have remained relatively unchanged for some time, the Health Minister Greg Hunt said.

"It is a tragedy that rare cancers are estimated to cause nearly 40% of total cancer deaths in 2017.

"This funding will create opportunities to address these devastating survival rates associated with some of our cruellest cancers and diseases."

Applications are now open for the third grant round under the Medical Research Future Fund's (MRFF) 'Rare Cancers, Rare Diseases and Unmet Need Clinical Trials Program'.

Grant applications remain open until 15 Aug 2018 - nhmrc.gov.au.

Botanix acne trial tick



LISTED medical dermatology company Botanix Pharmaceuticals has announced the recruitment of first patients for its BTX 1503 Phase 2 acne clinical trial, following recent regulatory approvals and the earlier successful Phase 1b results.

Approximately 360 patients will be enrolled for a 12-week period in leading dermatology clinics across the US and Australia.

The Phase 2 acne clinical trial is fully funded and expected to take 12 months to complete.

Botanix executive director Matt Callahan said, "Based on the recent comments from FDA Commissioner around the approval of cannabidiol drug Epidiolex (PD yesterday), we are rapidly following the FDA's preferred development pathway and conducting well controlled clinical studies to demonstrate the safety and efficacy of BTX 1503 compared to vehicle (placebo)".

TBN celebrates 38% growth

Cyber security alert

SMALL business owners are being warned of the need to know how to detect and avoid potential cyber attacks, the Pharmacy Guild of Australia says, quoting the Council of Small Business Organisations of Australia (COSBOA).

According to COSBOA, 20% of small businesses were affected by a cyber attack in 2016.

Some 11% of those surveyed were hit by ransom-ware with the average ransom paid being \$4,500, but 8% of those who paid a ransom did not get their files back.

In addition, 33% of those surveyed said they would not last a week without access to their critical information, and 48% said they had no back-up data.

COSBOA has suggested a threepillar approach to protecting small business - first is education and training, the second is protection and inoculation, and the third is cyber protection insurance.

COSBOA has a Cyber Security Awareness Test which is free to Guild members.

Re-entering pharmacy

PHARMACISTS seeking to re-enter the profession after a period of extended leave will now be better equipped thanks to the latest course offered by the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia

When returning from an extended break from practice, pharmacists can earn up to 74 Group 2 CPD points in PSA's Pharmacy Re-entry course, which provides clinical, legislative and practice updates to support their return to the profession.

PSA national president Dr Shane Jackson said the course includes online learning and a two-day workshop offered nationally, along with tailored support from a PSA pharmacist.

"The course structure is very flexible so pharmacists can fit it around work and family commitments," Jackson said.

The course is open to non-Australian pharmacists, but some overseas pharmacists will need to complete an accredited intern training program - psa.org.au.



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
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
