SHPA expands Board

THE Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia (SHPA) has boosted the size of its Board of Directors, with the addition of David Brennan, David Butt and Lindsay Cane as new "expert appointments".

The positions were enabled by overwhelming member support last year of the new, contemporary SHPA constitution (*PD* 26 Sep 2017).

Professor Michael Dooley, who was re-elected as SHPA president in Dec, said the new board would bring broad strategic experience and expertise at a time of strong organisational growth and a rapidly evolving pharmacy landscape.

"Not only is membership reaching new heights, but our growing suite of complementary member-driven programs is ensuring SHPA is the essential professional partner of pharmacists and technicians committed to making a difference in the challenging and complex hospital setting," Dooley said.

Brennan is an experienced investment banking executive and company director, while Lindsay Cane is currently ceo of the Royal Far West which provides specialist medical care and allied health support services for children in remote NSW.

NZ ticks some vaping

A RECENT District Court decision has ruled that vaping and heated tobacco products may be legally imported, sold and distributed in New Zealand.

The court case *Philip Morris v Ministry of Health* found all tobacco products - except chewing and dissolving types - could be lawfully sold under the Smoke-free Environments Act.

It is expected that the same regulatory controls that exist for smoked tobacco will now apply to heated tobacco products and vaping products manufactured from tobacco, including the ban on sales to minors and restrictions on advertising.

The NZ Ministry of Health has said it now plans to consider how best to apply risk-proportionate regulation to all tobacco and vaping products, and is developing standards for vaping products. Health losing trust

TRUST in the consumer health subsector has fallen 14 percentage points in the last two years, according to the "Edelman trust barometer" released yesterday.

Almost a third (31%) of Australians blamed private health insurance for the high cost of healthcare, followed by pharmaceutical companies (21%) and Medicare (14%).

However overall healthcare was the second most trusted sector at 69%, behind education at 70%.

Opioid GP arraigned

consultant from Taree has been found guilty of unsatisfactory professional conduct by the Civil and Administrative Tribunal of New South Wales in relation to 11 complaints that he had prescribed buprenorphine, fentanyl, hydromorphone, morphine, oxycodone, tapentadol or naloxone for a number of patients in his care.

He was also found to have failed to keep comprehensive medical records in relation to assessments of some patients and lacked insight as to their drug-seeking behaviour.

Dr Rajen Ragavan pleaded guilty to many but not all of the charges brought by the NSW Health Care Complaints Commission.

Ragavan has been ordered to undertake training as well as submit to audits of his medical practice - caselaw.nsw.gov.au.

A DIETARY supplement marketed to support weight loss and appetite control in New Zealand, Calocurb, has been reported to the NZ **Centre for Adverse Reactions** Monitoring for an association with an anaphylactic event requiring hospitalisation - medsafe.govt.nz.

Sleep specialists flag pharmacy concern

SIGMA Healthcare's planned rollout of pharmacy-based sleep testing services (PD 03 Mar) has reportedly alarmed sleep specialists who have branded it a "great example of poor medical practice".

According to an Australian Doctor report, Professor Eastwood, president of the Australian Sleep Association, said sleep apnoea was "a serious medical condition that requires serious care from trained professionals.

"These tests require a higher level of knowledge to interpret... pharmacists and GPs are not qualified," Eastwood said.

Amcal and Guardian pharmacies plan to roll out the \$99 testing in partnership with Australian Pharmacy Sleep Services from next month, targeting the estimated 1.8 million undiagnosed Australians living with sleep apnoea.

NSW palliative pharmacists

Corner FOR those who have always felt receiving urgent medical treatment can be quite stressful, your prayers have just been

answered by an ambulance

service in La Crosse, Wisconisn. Ambos in the area have recently been equipped with six different types of essential oils that can help treat pain, nausea or anxiety.

Medical director for Tri-State. Dr Chris Eberlein, said he noticed paramedics were often giving small doses of narcotics like fentanyl to patients who ended up not needing a prescription for pain medication.

"We started reviewing 'Why are they giving narcotics?' and really it came down to the fact that they didn't have many other things they could do in the ambulance ride," Eberlein said.

There is no word yet as to whether hot stone massages will be offered in the future.



NUDE-NUTS and desert-heads rejoice - researchers in the UK have discovered a potential new cure for baldness.

According to a report in PLOS Biology, the University of Manchester team have found a compound called WAY-316606 which reduces the activity of the SFRP1 protein, a growth regulator which affects hair follicles.

Human trials are still required, but lab tests found the drug significantly stimulated growth in samples from more than 40 male hair transplant patients.

THE NSW Government has announced a \$200,000 investment during 2018/19 to improve the support provided by pharmacists to palliative care patients in the community.

Parliamentary Secretary for **Regional and Rural Health Leslie** Williams said the NSW Government was "committed to breaking down barriers in the health system so people get palliative care at the right time, in the right ways".

Williams noted that in 2015/16 there were about 83,000 palliative care-related prescriptions provided to almost 52,000 patients nationally.

"This funding will help us collect insights from community pharmacists and other experts regarding how patients can be better supported by improving access to palliative care medication and providing advice on medicines," Williams said.

The move was announced at a **Clinical Excellence Commission**

workshop in Sydney yesterday, which is seeing consultation with representatives from community pharmacy, public and private palliative care services, community nursing residential aged care, academics and consumers on ways to enhance medication management.

A further meeting with key stakeholders is planned for 05 Jun "to develop outcomes that ensure improvements will be put into practice," Williams said.

SlimBody danger

THE TGA has warned that a product labelled SlimBody Advanced capsules contains the undeclared substance sibutramine, which was withdrawn in Oct 2010 after a study showed an increased



risk of major cardiac events.
