CHF pushes for 7CPA seat

THE Consumers Health Forum has confirmed it will "urge the government to ensure the next negotiations for the Community Pharmacy Agreement include consumer representatives".

According to a CHF statement issued yesterday, the government's response to the King Review of Pharmacy Remuneration and Regulation has "left open the prospect" of the organisation being part of the 7CPA.

"At a time when CHF research tells us that consumers trust pharmacists, value community pharmacy and want pharmacy services to be opened up to be more integrated with the rest of the health system, the government has supported a limited number of the recommendations of the review to reform community pharmacy," said CHF ceo Leanne Wells.

She noted calls from pharmacy and general practice clinical leaders that "modern pharmacy needs to shift from its 'dispensing' mentality to one of community care.

"This highlights the need for the voice of consumers to balance the influence of pharmacy owners."

Wells said over the years the CHF had played a significant role in shaping important elements of community health practice, including the organisation's role in the genesis of the Australian Medicines Handbook.

She said including representatives of consumers alongside those of professional pharmacists and owners "makes sense when we consider the importance and cost of pharmacies to the community".

As well as heading up the CHF, Wells is a director of painaustralia and was recently appointed as a Councillor to the Australian Pharmacy Council (PD 09 May).

UQ AMR research funded

Non-opioid addiction withdrawal support

THE U.S. Food and Drug Administration has announced it has approved Lucemyra (lofexidine hydrochloride) for the mitigation of withdrawal symptoms to facilitate abrupt discontinuation of opioids in adults.

While Lucemyra may lessen the severity of withdrawal symptoms, it for up to 14 days.

AMERICAN confectionery maker Hershey manufactures products classified as a "sometimes" food.

But a super-fan of the company's Reeses Peanut Butter Cups is likely to be chowing down on the sweet things for quite a long time now, after he was presented with a swimming pool full of the chocolatey delights.

Ohio-based Jon Ernst became famous online in 2015 after he received an employee gift card from the store where he worked and spent the whole thing on Reeses' Peanut Butter Cups.

The company has now rewarded his viral fame with the poolful of product as part of an "Outrageous Acts" campaign to launch a new candy bar.



SMOKING cigarettes is a well established contributor to increased mortality, and "vaping" has been touted as a slightly safer way to get a nicotine hit.

However that definitely wasn't the case for a Florida man who tragically died recently after an electronic cigarette exploded, killing him instantly as pieces of the device lodged in his skull.

The 38-year-old's body was discovered by emergency workers as they put out a fire caused by the explosion.

The Tampa Bay Times reported the official cause was "projectile wound of head," with the accidental death believed to be the first fatality from a vape pen explosion.

6CPA backlog

THE Health Department has advised that the 6CPA Registration and Claiming Portal is currently experiencing a backlog of claims "due to the implementation of system changes to accommodate new claiming requirements implemented form 1 February 2018".

Extra resources have been put in place, with officials assuring affected pharmacies that the 6CPA team is committed to clearing the backlog as quickly as possible.

Antibiotics linked to kidney stones

COMMON antibiotics may be to blame for the rising incidence of kidney stones, particularly among children, according to a casecontrol study involving more than 260,000 patients, and published in the Journal of the American Society of Nephrology.

Five classes of oral antibiotics: sulfas, cephalosporins, fluoroquinolones, nitrofurantoin/ methenamine and broad-spectrum penicillins were linked to increased risk of nephrolithiasis - CLICK HERE.

The product has been found to contain the undeclared prescription-only substance tadalafil, and neither the capsules nor the place of manufacture have been assessed and approved for safety and efficacy by the TGA.


