Compounding fact sheet

THE Pharmacy Council of NSW has released a fact sheet about raw materials used in compounding, in response to a number of complaints received in relation to the authenticity of raw materials used in compounded medicines.

Council president Stuart
Ludington said complex
compounding was an area of
growing concern, with the body
working to provide practical
guidance to pharmacists to support
improved compounding practices.

"Pharmacists have an obligation to ensure that compounded preparations are safe, efficacious and of consistently high quality.

Quit workshops

QUIT Victoria and the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) are launching a new free training session for pharmacists in Victoria to help their patients quit smoking.

The workshops will be held across metro and regional



Victoria between Jun and Sep and will equip pharmacists with the latest evidence-based approach to smoking cessation care.

The courses will train pharmacists to provide a 3-stage brief intervention (Ask, Advise, Help) for smoking cessation, to advise on pharmacotherapy use and to refer to, and work with, Quitline for intensive behavioural support.

"Part of this is ensuring all raw materials used comply with pharmacopoeial standards and are produced by acceptable manufacturers," Ludington said.

THE owner of a gymnasium in the USA has caused a social media sensation by erecting a billboard that some people found offensive - but many were highly amused. The advertisement outside Pell

City Fitness (pictured) says "Tired of being fat and ugly? Just be ugly!" and was initially the subject of a removal order by city officials.

However after much online banter enforcement officers relented and said the only issue was he had put up the sign without a necessary permit.

He has now filed the correct paperwork but warned "if you were offended by the sign, you would not fit in at the gym".



SALES of sticking plasters are likely to plummet if a British judge has his way.

Retiring magistrate Nic Madge has proposed making kitchen knives more blunt, as a way of curbing Britain's "soaring knife crime epidemic".

Knife crime rose 22% in the UK last year, while stabbing deaths among teenagers and young adults reached an all time high.

Laws aiming to curb availability of weapons had had little effect because offenders had simply taken knives from a cutlery drawer.

He urged authorities to consider preventing the sale of long pointed knives, also suggesting police could organise a program to grind down the points of lawfully obtained sharp kitchen utensils.

CW chiefs in AFR rich list

CHEMIST Warehouse founders Jack Gance and Mario Verrocchi have been highlighted in the annual Australian Financial Review (AFR) 2018 Rich List, with the pair coming in at 93rd and 94th in the list.

The report estimates that Gance's fortune is worth \$813 million, fractionally ahead of his colleague at \$803 million, with the AFR saying their combined business makes more than \$100 million in profit annually.

Key achievements cited included establishing the Le Tan, Le Specs and Australis brands, as well as the rapid growth of Chemist Warehouse which now boasts more than 300 outlets across Australia.

The pair are also part of the \$725 million Home Consortium which is developing sites purchased from Woolworths following the demise of its ill-fated Masters Hardware.

Other pharmacy sector millionaires in the list include Marcus Blackmore at 137th spot with an estimated \$594 million in assets - including about 25% of the listed complementary medicines manufacturer founded by his father. Also just scraping into the list at Millner and his family are listed as 69th on the list with assets

Supporting rural pharmacies

THE Intern Incentive Allowance for Rural Pharmacies – Extension Program (IIARP-EP) supports the rural pharmacy workforce by enabling community pharmacies in rural areas to retain a newly registered pharmacist beyond the initial intern period.

A maximum allowance of \$20,000 per pharmacy may be made to eligible community pharmacies that have retained their pharmacy intern for a continuous 12-month period.

There are a maximum of 10 allowances available each year.

For the purpose of the Intern Incentive Allowance for Rural Pharmacies – Extension Program, the Community Pharmacy must be located in PhARIA categories 4 to 6 and applications must be received no later than 90 days after the commencement of employment of the pharmacist.
