New med cannabis

ASX-LISTED biopharma MGC Pharma has announced that Australians suffering from drugresistant epilepsy will be able to access a new medical marijuanabased treatment by Dec this year.

Following recent Human Research **Ethics Committee endorsement** from St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne for the use of MGC's CannEpil in the treatment of adult patients with drug-resistant epilepsy, the Therapeutic Goods Administration has approved the product.

MGC Pharmaceuticals co-founder and MD Roby Zomer said, "We are delighted to announce the availability of our first product CannEpil for supply under the Authorised Prescriber Scheme.

CSO review outcome soon

THERE'S speculation that the Health Department could release the highly anticipated findings of its review of the Community Service Obligation within the next couple of weeks, with rhetoric around the issue ramping up in recent days.

Sigma CEO Mark Hooper, who is also Chair of wholesaler group The **National Pharmaceutical Services** Association (NPSA), defended the CSO at a conference this week (PD yesterday) and warned of the dangers of a "single point of failure" when it comes to exclusive direct distribution arrangements.

However at the same eyeforpharma event, DHL CEO Saul Resnick pointed out that more than two thirds of product currently being delivered to wholesalers is actually coming via DHL "so if there's a single point of failure it's already there...the single source of supply in this context actually improves the likelihood of product getting safely to where it needs to go".

Free HPV vax for men

MEN aged 20 to 34 who have sex with men (MSM) will be offered free vaccination against the human papillomavirus (HPV) in NSW.

is offering the four-valent human papillomavirus vaccine (4vHPV), Gardasil, for free to MSM (trans inclusive) due to an increased risk of anal cancer.

three doses and made available in all publicly funded sexual health clinics around the state.

Resnick was quoted by Pharma in Focus as saying the CSO was outdated and no longer relevant, but has not ruled out participating in the scheme after the details of the review are released.

Current contracts under the CSO are held by Sigma, Symbion, API, National Pharmacies and CH2, but expire in Dec this year.

Resnick urged change in the CSO, saying he believes subsidisation of deliveries to pharmacies in metropolitan areas is unjustified.

"I think if anything the CSO should be funded towards rural, regional and remote areas...where the money's actually needed," he said.

The NPSA has warned that direct distribution of "cherry picked" high value products threatens the sustainability of all wholesalers.

AMAZON clearly has healthcare in its sights - not only is the internet giant looking at pharmaceutical distribution (PD 03 Jul) - this week it has gone a step further by offering diagnosis.

A new patent issued in the US is titled "Voice-based determination of physical and emotional characteristics of users," and is based on the Amazon Echo voice controlled gadget.

Apparently the system is able to detect "abnormal" physical conditions - such as a sore throat, cough or sniffle - while when it comes to emotions it can pick up whether the user is happy or sad.

Of course it's all about sales for Amazon, with the platform then communicating with an "audio content server" in order to deliver an appropriate advertisement.

"For example, certain content such as content related to cough drops or flu medicine, may be targeted towards users who have sore throats...Alexa might then ask 'would you like to order cough drops with one hour delivery,"" the patent says.

Guild ticks tax break

THE Pharmacy Guild of Australia has welcomed the Morrison Government announcement that brings forward the implementation of tax cuts for businesses with annual turnover of less than \$50m.

Guild Executive Director David Quilty said the earlier tax cuts for small, medium and familysized businesses would benefit community pharmacy businesses across Australia, allowing them to invest in the business and employ staff with more certainty.

"In a tough trading environment it is pleasing to see the Government recognise the importance of maintaining the viability of small businesses such as community pharmacies," Quilty said.

"They employ thousands of Australians and deliver a vital service within our health system and in local communities."

"We would certainly hope to see the legislation enabling the bringing forward of the tax cuts passed through the Parliament at the earliest opportunity."

FDA generic advances

THE US Food and Drug Administration's Commissioner Scott Gottlieb has announced a program to support faster development of generic copies of "complex drugs" which are more difficult to "genericise".

THE Spring issue of the Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia (SHPA) official member magazine, Pharmacy GRIT, presents contributions from pharmacists and other health professional colleagues across Australia unpacking the concept of "patientcentred care" from the viewpoint of all pharmacy roles.

SHPA Chief Executive Kristin Michaels said, "While the concept itself can be hard to pin down, patient-centred care is regarded as a hallmark of progressive and human health systems".

Pharmacists fight AMR

COMMUNITY pharmacists have been given an essential role in a national campaign by Public Health England (PHE) to help fight antimicrobial resistance (AMR), according to a Pharmaceutical Journal report.

Each community pharmacy across the country is receiving advice leaflets around the selfmanagement of respiratory tract infections to give to customers who visit the pharmacy with a cough or cold and flu-like symptoms.

The leaflets are to be the starting point for counselling around the last-ditch role of antibiotics.
